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A Crochet Shawl

By: Bernat

Bernat has come up with this amazing free crochet pattern. A pink crochet shawl for any time of year. Add this brightly colored shawl to your wardrobe, add some color to your life.



Materials:

- Yarn: Bernat[®] Satin (120 g/4.2 oz; 230 m/251 yds) #00432 (Flamingo) 3 balls
- Crochet Hook: Size 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) crochet hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

Gauge: 7 sps and 6 rows = 4 ins [10 cm] in pat.

Measurements: Approx 57 ins [144.5 cm] wide x 31 ins [78.5 cm] deep.

Instructions:

Note: sp(s) = space(s). Pattern is calculated in spaces throughout.

Ch 201.

1st row: (WS). 1 dc in 5th ch from hook (counts as 1 dc and ch-1 sp). *Ch 1. Miss next ch. 1 dc in next ch. Rep from * across. 99 sps. Turn.

2nd row: Ch 4. Miss first ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc. (Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) twice. *(Yoh and draw up a loop. Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times in next ch-1 sp. Yoh and draw through all 4 loops on hook – cluster made. 1 dc in next dc. (Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) 3 times. Rep from * to end of row. Turn.

3rd row: Sl st in first dc. Sl st in next ch-1 sp. Sl st in next dc. Ch 4. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc – beg dec made.

*Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp or cluster. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from * to last ch-1 sp. Turn. Leave rem sp unworked.

4th row: Beg dec. (Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) twice. *Cluster in next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc. (Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) 3 times. Rep from * to last 5 ch-1 sps. Cluster in next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc. (Ch 1.

Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) 3 times. Turn. Leave rem sp unworked. Rep last 2 rows until there are 5 ch-1 sps. Next row: Beg dec. (Ch 1. Miss next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc) twice. Turn. Leave rem st unworked.

Next row: Beg dec. Fasten off.



Finishing

Outer Edging: 1st rnd: With RS facing, join yarn with sl st at top left corner and work 1 rnd sc evenly down side edge, around point, up other side edge and across foundation row of Shawl. Join with sl st to first sc. 2nd rnd: Ch 1. Working from left to right instead of from right to left as usual, work 1 reverse sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.





Autumn Shawl

This beautiful shawl has striped detail in deep earth tones perfect for the Fall. This free crochet shawl pattern is for all skill levels and it will cozy up every outfit!



MATERIALS

- Bernat[®] Satin
- (100 g/3.5 oz; 149 m/163 yds)
- 2 balls each of:
- A: #04013 Mocha
- B: #04018 Buff
- C: #04521 Amber
- D: #04435 Cameo
- E: #04531 Rouge
- Crochet Hook: size 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) or size needed to obtain gauge.

MEASUREMENTS

Approx 24 x 70 ins [61 x 178 cm].

GAUGE

13 sc and 14 rows = 4 ins [10 cm]

Stripe Pat: Work 2 rows of each color in following sequence: A, B, C, A, D, E. These 12 rows form Stripe Pat.

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: Shawl is worked widthwise. With A, ch 227.

1st row: (RS). 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 226 sc. Turn.
2nd and alt rows: Ch 2 (does not count as st). 1 hdc in each st to end of row. Join B. Turn.

First 2 rows of Stripe Pat are completed. 3rd row: With B, ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 hdc. *(Pulling long loop, 1 sc in next foundation ch two rows below – long sc made) twice. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from * to last 3 hdc. 1 sc in each of last 3 hdc. Turn.

5th row: Ch 1. 1 sc in first hdc. *Long sc in each of next 2 hdc two rows below. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from * ending with 1 sc in last hdc. Join C. Turn.

7th row: With C, ch 1. 1 sc in each of first 3 hdc. *Long sc in each of next 2 hdc two rows below. 1 sc in each of next 2 hdc. Rep from * to last 3 hdc. 1 sc in each of last 3 hdc. Turn.

8th row: As 2nd row joining A at end of row.

Keeping cont of Stripe Pat, rep 5th to 8th rows for pat until work from beg measures approx 24 ins [61 cm], ending with a WS row. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With RS facing join A with sl st to left corner of side edge. Work in sc across side edge of Shawl. Fasten off. Rep across other side.



Black Mesh Shawl

Crochet a lovely black shawl in an openwork pattern with fun crochet ball trim. Instructions to make the crochet "bobbles" included. This crochet shawl is a great way to wrap up in the evenings.

Difficulty Level: Expert



Materials:

- Yarn: Senso Metallics (Article 740), size
 3, color # 1404 54 balls
 (100yards/ball)
- Crochet hook: US C/2 or D/3 (3mm)
- Optional crochet ball trim add 5 balls
- Optional clear 5/16" diameter glue on "jewels" - 95

Size: 52" square

Abbreviations:

bo = bobble

ch(s) = chain

dc = double crochet

dc3tog = double crochet 3 together

dc4tog = double crochet 4 together

lp(s) = loop(s)

P-st = pattern stitch

rem = remain(ing)

rep = repeat

sc = single crochet

sc2tog = single crochet 2 together

sl st = slip stitch

sp = space

sp = space

st(s) = stitch(es)

t-ch = turning chain

tr = treble

yo = yarn over

* ... * = repeat instructions between asterisks as many times as directed.

Pattern Stitch:

Start with a treble working the first two lps only, dc3tog including one lp of treble, finish treble, dc 3x around upper part of treble.

Step by step description: With yo twice, insert hook into ch or ch3 sp, yo and draw up 1 lp, yo and draw through 2 lps on hook, * yo, insert hook into next ch or same sp, yo and draw loop through 2 lps on hook * rep 3 x, yo and draw through 4 lps on hook, yo and draw through 2 lps on hook, yo and draw through rem 2 lps, dc 3x around the top of tr (working sts into ch refers to 1st row only, in subsequent rows all sts are worked into ch3 sp).

Instructions:

With Senso Metallics ch 353.

Row 1: Start a P-st in 6th ch from hook and into next 3chs, * ch3, skip 3 sts below P-st into next 4 chs * rep across to last ch, tr, ch7





& turn.

Row 2: * P-st into ch3 sp, ch3 * ep across, tr into top of t-ch, ch4 & turn.

Row 3: * P-st into ch3 sp, ch 3 * rep across ending with P-st and tr into 4th t-ch, ch 7 & turn.

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until the shawl is square, ending with a row 2.

Fasten off.

Border:

Start away from a corner and attach yarn to the bottom of a treble along a side edge, ch2 and work dc3tog over the treble, * ch2, work 4dc bo into 2nd ch of next row's t-ch, ch5, sl st into 3rd ch from hook, ch2, work 4dc bo into next ch, ch2, dc4tog over next tr * rep to corner (ch 2, 4dc bo, ch5, sl st into 3rd ch from hook, ch2, 4dc bo) all into top of corner st, continue along top edge ch 2, work dc4tog over ch3 sp, ch2, work 4dc bo into 2nd dc, ch5, sl st into 3rd ch from hook, ch2, work 4dc bo into next st *, rep to corner ending with dc4tog over ch3 sp.

Repeat corners and edges to complete round, close with a sl st. Fasten off.

Options:

Bobbles: Make as many as are needed around the border.

Attach yarn with a sl st to a picot along border leaving a long enough tail to weave through the chain sts and into the ball, ch12, holding the chain sts in front of the hook sc 8x into 2nd ch from hook, sc 2x into 1st sc made, sc 2x into next st 7x (16sts), continue to work in spiral rounds and sc 30x, stuff with thread. *sc2tog, sc into next st * rep until ball is closed. Fasten off.

Jewels: glue at regular intervals around the inner edge of the shawl's border.



Breezy Shawl


Use this pattern to make a crochet shawl that's breezy and cool in the warmer months. The breezy shawl is a fun way to add interest to an outfit.





Materials:

- One size US I-9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook, or size to obtain gauge.
- Yarn needle
- Naturally Caron.com Country (75% Microdenier Acrylic/25% Merino Wool):
 12 oz (A), 2 oz (B), Shown in: #0014
 Deep Purple (A); # 0013 Spruce (B).
- Pattern



Instructions:

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

Shawl measures approximately 61"/155 cm wide x 31"/78.5 cm long, including edging

GAUGE

Rounds 1–5 of square = $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$ "/9 x 9 cm; 1 square = 8×8 "/20.5 x 20.5 cm.

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch), double crochet (dc), single crochet (sc), slip stitch (slip st), treble crochet (tr)



SQUARE (make 20)

- 1. With A, chain 4; join with slip st in first ch to form a ring.
- 2. Round 1 (RS): Ch 1, work 8 sc in ring; join with slip st in first sc, turn—8 sc.
- 3. Round 2: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), *dc in next sc, ch 1; repeat from * around; join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch, turn—8 dc and 8 ch-1 sps.
- Round 4: Slip st into first ch-1 sp, ch 5
 (counts as dc, ch 2), *dc in next ch-1 sp,
 ch 2; repeat from * around; join with
 slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch, turn—
 16 dc and 16 ch-2 sps.
- 6. Round 5: Ch 4 (counts as tr), slip st in same st as join, ch 1, *(tr, slip st) in next dc, ch 1; repeat from * around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch, turn—16 tr, 16 slip sts, and 16 ch-1 sps.
- 7. Round 6: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), *dc in next tr, ch 3; repeat from * around; join with slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch, turn—16 dc, and 16 ch-3 sps.
- 8. Round 7: Ch 3 (counts as dc), (dc, tr, 2 dc) in first ch-3 sp (corner made), ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, *(2 dc, tr, 2 dc) in next ch-3 sp (corner made), ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3; repeat from * around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch, turn.

- 9. Round 8: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), dc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc (center dc of 3-dc group), [ch 3, dc in next dc] twice, ch 2, sk next dc, (2 dc, tr, 2 dc) in next tr (corner made), ch 2, *sk next dc, dc in next dc, ch 3, dc in next dc, ch 3, sk next dc, sc in next dc, [ch 3, dc in next dc] twice, ch 2, sk next dc, (2 dc, tr, 2 dc) in next tr (corner made), ch 2; repeat from * around; join with slip st in 4th ch of beginning ch, turn.
- 10. Round 9: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr (corner made), ch 2, sk next dc, [dc in next dc, ch 3] 3 times, dc in next sc, ch 3, *[dc in next dc, ch 3] twice, dc in next dc, ch 2, sk next dc, (dc, tr, dc) in next tr (corner made), ch 2, sk next dc, [dc in next dc, ch 3] 3 times, dc in next sc, ch 3; repeat from * around, dc in next dc, ch 3; join with slip st in 4th ch of beginning ch. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Arrange squares according to assembly diagram. Hold neighboring squares with RS together, and corner treble crochet stitches and side double crochet stitches aligned. Sew neighboring sides of squares together, beginning and ending at a corner treble stitch, and stitching through one loop of each stitch only. Note: The numbers on the assembly diagram provide a recommended order of assembly.

Edging

- 1. With RS facing, join B with slip st in any dc before a ch-sp along edge of shawl.
- 2. Round 1: Ch 1, sc in same st as join; work 2 sc in each ch-2 sp, 2 sc in each ch-3 sp, sc in each dc, 2 sc in each outer



corner tr; at inner corners, sc in dc after ch-2 sp, sc in the corner, sc in next dc; join with slip st in first st, turn. Note: Ensure that you have a multiple of 3 sts worked in this round, work one or two more sc if needed.

- 3. Round 2: Slip st in first 2 sc, (tr, slip st) in next sc, *slip st in next 2 sc, (tr, slip st) in next sc; rep from * around; join with slip st in first slip st.
- 4. Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.







Crochet Shawl for Summer

This crochet shawl for summer is great to wear over a dress on a chilly summer night. Try this free crochet pattern to make a pretty shawl with fringe for all of those special occasions.



Materials:

- Crochet hook: US size K/10.5 (6.5mm); tapestry needle (tn)
- Caron International's Feathers (65% acrylic / 35% nylon; 1.75oz / 50g, 70yd / 64m): 8 skeins #0009 Sandpiper

Instructions:

GAUGE

In pattern st, 5 [dc, ch 1] and 5 rows = 4"/10 cm

Pattern stitch is very flexible; Gauge is not crucial for this project.

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch)
Double crochet (dc)
Single crochet (sc)
Triple crochet (tr)

Slip stitch (sl st)

SHAWL

- 1. Ch 4; join with a sl st to first ch to form a ring.
- 2. Row 1: Ch 4 (counts as tr), work 2 dc, 1 tr in ring, turn—4 sts.
- 3. Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as tr, ch 1), work [1 dc in space between sts, ch 1] twice, work [dc, ch 1, tr] in turning ch (inc), turn—5 sts/4 ch-1 spaces.
- 4. Row 3: Ch 4 (counts as tr ch-1), [dc, ch 1, dc] in first ch-1 space (inc), ch 1, * dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1; repeat from * to turning ch, work [dc, ch 1, tr] in turning ch (inc), turn—7 sts/6 ch-1 spaces.
- 5. Repeat Row 3, increasing 2 sts each row until there are 83 sts/82 ch-1 spaces; do not break yarn, turn.

SHELL EDGING

Continuing along upper edge, ch 1, work 1 sc in first ch-1 space, * 3 dc in next ch-1 space, sc in next ch-1 space; repeat from * to turning ch, end 1 sc in turning ch; do NOT break yarn, do NOT turn.

FRINGE

Ch 15, sc in same space as last sc (turning ch); continuing along side edge, * ch 15, sc in next space; repeat from * around, working [ch 15, sc in beginning ring] twice to turn the corner; join with a sl st to first sc of Shell edging.

Fasten off.



Flower Triangle Shawl

With this easy shawl crochet pattern, create a light and lacy cover with large flower embellishments. Three different crochet flowers adorn this lovely crochet shawl.



MATERIALS:

- Yarn: Caron International's Simply Soft (100% acrylic; 6 oz/170 g, 315 yds/288 m skein): 24 oz (4 skeins) Shown in: #9913 Lt. Country Blue
- Hook: One size US H-8 (5mm), or size to obtain gauge
- Yarn needle

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

approximately 76"/193cm across upper edge x 38"/96.5cm long, excluding fringe

GAUGE: In Mesh st, 8 mesh sts (dc, ch) and 8 rows = 4"/10cm. Gauge is not critical for this project.

STITCHES USED

Chain (ch): Begin by making a slip knot on your hook. * Wrap the yarn around the hook (yarn over) and pull up a loop, [draw the yarn through the loop on the hook to form the first chain]. Repeat from * for number of chains required. Note: The loop on the hook is not included when counting the number of chains.

Double Crochet (dc): Yarn over hook, insert hook into stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, [yarn over and draw through two loops on hook] twice.

Half Double Crochet (hdc): Yarn over hook, insert hook into stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through all three loops on hook.



Reverse single crochet (Rev sc): Work as single crochet except, work across the row from left to right instead of right to left.

Single Crochet (sc): Insert hook in stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over and draw through both loops on hook.

Slip Stitch (slip st): Insert hook in the stitch indicated, yarn over and draw through both the stitch and the loop on the hook.

Treble Crochet (tr): Yarn over hook two times, insert hook in stitch indicated, yarn over and pull up a loop, [yarn over and draw through two loops] three times.

SHAWL

Beginning at upper edge, chain 246.

Row 1: Dc in sixth ch from hook (counts as first mesh st), * ch 1, skip 1 ch, dc in the next ch; repeat from * across, turn—121 mesh sts.

Row 2: Decrease 1 mesh st at each side as follows: Slip st in first ch-1 space and in the next dc, ch 4 (counts as first mesh st), * dc in next dc, ch 1; repeat from * across to last mesh st, turn, leaving remaining sts unworked, turn—2 mesh sts decreased; 119 mesh sts remain after Row 2.

Repeat Row 2 until one mesh st remains.

Fasten off.

Edging: With RS facing, join yarn at upper right-hand corner.

Round 1: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc evenly around entire edge of shawl, working

3 sc in remaining next 2 corners, end work 2 sc in same st as first sc, join with a slip st to first st; do NOT fasten off.

Row 2: With RS facing, working from left to right, work 1 row Rev sc across upper edge of Shawl.

Fasten off.

FLOWERS (make 3 of each type)

Flower 1

Chain 5; join with a slip st to form ring.

Round 1 (RS): Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring, join with a slip st to first sc—12 sc.

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as a dc), dc in same sc, work 2 dc in each sc around, join with a slip st to third ch of beg ch-3—24 dc.

Round 3: Slip st between the 2 dc; ch 1, sc in same space; ch 3, skip next 3 dc; * sc in space between last dc skipped and the next dc, ch 3, skip next 3 dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st to first sc—8 sc/ch-3 spaces.

Round 4: Ch 1, sc in same sc, in next ch-3 space work [hdc, dc, 3 tr, dc, hdc] for petal, * sc in next sc, work petal in next ch-3 space; repeat from * around, join with a slip st to first sc—8 petals.

Fasten off.

Flower 2

Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.



Round 1 (RS): Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring, join with a slip st to first sc—12 sc.

Round 2: Ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3), * skip 1 sc, dc in next sc, 3 ch; repeat from * around, join with slip st to first dc—6 dc/ch-3 spaces.

Round 3: Work [sc, 2 dc, tr, 2 dc, sc) in each ch-3 space around, join with a slip st to first sc—6 petals.

Fasten off.

Flower 3

Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 7 (counts as sc, ch 6), sc in ring, work [ch 6, sc in ring] 5 times, join with a slip st to first ch of beginning ch—6 ch-6 spaces.

Work remaining rounds without joining at the end of each round.

Round 2: Slip st in each of the next 3 ch, work [ch 4, sc in next ch-6 space] 6 times—6 ch-4 spaces.

Round 3: Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in next sc) 6 times.

Round 4: Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in each of the next 2 sc, skip 1 sc] 6 times.

Round 5: Work [ch 4, 2 sc in next ch-4 space, sc in each of the next 3 sc, skip 1 sc] 6 times.

Fasten off.

Flower 4

Chain 4; join with a slip st to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 1, [sc in ring, ch 6] 8 times, join with a slip st to first sc—8 ch-6 spaces.

Round 2: In ch-6 space work [ch 4, 3 tr, ch 4, slip st), * slip st in next ch-6 space, work [ch 4, 3 tr, ch 4, slip st) in same space; repeat from * around—8 petals.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Block pieces lightly. Attach the Flowers to Shawl in groups of 4, one group on each corner area of shawl or as desired. Using yarn needle, weave in ends.

Fringe

Cut strands 12" long. Holding 3 strands together, fold fringe in half. Using crochet hook, * insert hook from WS to RS into first st at upper corner, pull through loop, insert ends into loop and pull tight against edge; repeat from *, working a fringe approx every 1/2" along the 2 sides of Shawl; leave upper edge without fringe.
