## Autumn Granny Afghan

This easy granny square afghan uses bold fall colors to bring the warmth of family and Thanksgiving into your living room.



### MATERIALS

- Bernat® Super Value Harvest Colors (197 g/7 oz)
- 1 ball each of:
  - Main Color (MC): (#53015 Taupe Heather)
  - Contrast A: (#53521 Rustic Heather)
  - Contrast B: (#53014 Steel Blue Heather)
  - Contrast C: (#53241 Moss Heather)
  - Contrast D: (#53309 Plum Heather)
  - Contrast E: (#53203 Teal Heather)
  - Contrast F: (#53522 Redwood Heather)

### MEASUREMENTS

Approx 46 x 52 ins [117 x 132 cm].

**GAUGE:** 12 sc and 13 rows = 4 ins [10 cm]. Motif = 6 ins [15 cm] square.

### INSTRUCTIONS

#### Motif I

\*\*Ch 4. Join in rnd with sl st to form a ring.  
1st rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in ring. Ch 2. (3 dc. Ch 2) 3 times in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.\*\*

2nd rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

4th rnd: Sl st in next 2 dc and ch-2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. [(Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice. Ch 1. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 3 times. (Ch 1. 3 dc in next ch-1 sp) twice. Ch 1. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

#### Motif II

Work from \*\* to \*\* as given for Motif I.  
2nd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. [(2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc] 3 times. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

3rd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). [1 dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-

2 sp] 4 times. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

4th rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). [1 dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in next ch-2 sp] 4 times. 1 dc in each of next 4 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3.

Fasten off.

### AFGHAN

Work Motif I, as follows:

With MC, make 1.

With A, make 6.

With B, make 3.

With C, make 4.

With D, make 5.

With E, make 2.

With F, make 7.

Work Motif II, as follows:

With MC, make 7.

With A, make 2.

With B, make 5.

With C, make 4.

With D, make 3.

With E, make 6.

With F, make 1.

Sew 8 Motifs into 7 Strips (see Diagram).

Edging: With RS of work facing, join MC with sl st to any corner ch-2 sp. Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as sl st. Work 1 rnd of sc evenly around entire Afghan, having 3 sc in corners. Join with sl st to first sc. Join A. Rep last rnd in following sequence: A, B, C, D, E, and F. Fasten off.

## Beginner Granny Afghan

By: Kathleen Sams for Red Heart Yarn

Use this free crochet afghan pattern to make a beautiful versatile granny afghan. The colorful flowers make a really nice design. Follow the diagram to get a granny just as good as this one.



### Materials:

- RED HEART® “Super Saver®”: 3 skeins 313 Aran
- A, 1 skein each 320 Cornmeal B, 661 Frosty Green C,
- 528 Medium Purple D, 774 Light Raspberry E, and 382
- Country Blue F.
- Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9].
- Yarn needle.

**GAUGE:** Square measures 5½” x 5½”.

**CHECK YOUR**

**GAUGE.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

**NOTE:** After the first square, all others are joined while working Rnd 5.

**FIRST SQUARE 1**

Rnd 1: With B ch 4; 2 dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, [3 dc in same st, ch 3] 3 times

more; join with a slip st to top of ch-3.

Fasten off.

Rnd 2: Join C in any ch-3 space; (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) all in same space, ch 1, \* (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) all in next ch-3 space, ch 1;

repeat from \* around; join in top of ch-3.

Fasten off.

Rnd 3: Join D in any ch-1 space; (ch 4, 2 tr, ch 3, 3 tr) all in same space for corner, ch 3, skip ch-3 space, \* (3 tr, ch 3, 3 tr) all in next ch-1 space for corner, ch 3, skip ch-3 space; repeat from \* around; join. Fasten off.

Rnd 4: Join A in any corner ch-3 space; (ch 3, 2 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) all in same space, ch 3, \* working over the ch-3 of

Rnd 3, 3 dc into ch-3 space of Rnd 2, ch 3 \*\*, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) all in next ch-3 space, ch 3; repeat from \* around, end at \*\*; join.

First Square Only-Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 2 dc, \* 3 sc in corner ch-3 space, sc in next 3 dc, ch 1; working over the ch-3 space of Rnd 4, sc in 2nd tr of 3-tr group of Rnd 3 – long sc made; ch 1, sc in next 3 dc, ch 1, long sc, ch 1, sc in next 3 dc; repeat from \* around; join. Fasten off.

All Remaining Squares-Joining Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 2 dc, sc in corner ch-3 space, slip st in center sc of corner of completed square, sc in corner space of square in progress, [sc in next 3 dc, slip st in corresponding ch-1 space of completed square, long sc, slip st in next ch-1 space of completed square] twice, sc in next 3 dc, sc in next ch-3 corner space, slip st in center sc of next corner of completed square, sc in corner space of square in progress – one side joined; \* [sc in next 3 dc, ch 1, long sc, ch 1] twice \*\*, sc in next 3 dc, 3 sc in corner ch-3 space; repeat from \* around, end at \*\*; join. Fasten off.

**Note:** Join on 2 sides in similar manner when necessary.

**SQUARES** 1 (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10)

Work Rnds 1-4 same as First Square 1 and  
Joining Rnd

5 as above in the following color sequences  
following the diagram:

Square 1 (Make 7 More): B, C, D, A, A.

Square 2 (Make 5): C, D, E, A, A.

Square 3 (Make 5): C, E, C, A, A.

Square 4 (Make 7): F, C, B, A, A.

Square 5 (Make 5): E, F, D, A, A.

Square 6 (Make 6): D, B, E, A, A.

Square 7 (Make 5): E, B, C, A, A.

Square 8 (Make 7): D, F, B, A, A.

Square 9 (Make 4): F, E, C, A, A.

Square 10 (Make 4): B, F, E, A, A.

**Border**

Rnd 1: With right side facing, join D in any  
st; ch 1, sc evenly around entire afghan,  
taking care to keep work flat  
and working 3 sc in each corner; join with a  
slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Rnd 2: With right side facing, join E in any  
st; ch 1, sc in each sc around and work 3 sc  
in center sc of corner 3-sc group; join.  
Fasten off.

Rnds 3-6: Repeat Rnd 2 with B, D, F, A.  
Weave in ends.

**ABBREVIATIONS:** A, B, etc. = color A,  
B, etc.; ch = chain;  
dc = double crochet; mm = millimeters; rnd  
= round;  
sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); tr =  
treble crochet;  
\* or \*\* = repeat whatever follows the \* or  
\*\* as indicated.

## Crochet Granny Afghan

By: Darla J. Fanton of Red Heart Yarn

Use this free crochet afghan pattern for a warm night next to the fire. Super Saver yarn makes it nice and warm. This pattern calls for a J hook.



Afghan measures 52½" x 64½".

**RED HEART® "Super Saver®":** 2 Skeins 931 Seagrass **A**, 1 skein 320 Cornmeal **B**, 2 skeins 505 Aruba Sea **C**, 3 skeins 631 Light Sage **D**.

### Materials:

- **Crochet Hook:** 6mm [US J-10].
- Yarn needle.

[Diagram](#)



= Rnds 1-2 of block

**GAUGE:** Rnds 1-2 = 3" square; each block = 7" square. **CHECK YOUR GAUGE.** Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

**To Change Color in Dc:** Work last dc until 2 loops remain on hook, with new color, yarn over and draw through last 2 loops.

**BLOCK (Make 63):** With **A**, ch 5; join with a slip st in first ch to form a ring.  
**Rnd 1:** Ch 3, 2 dc in ring, [ch 2, 3 dc in ring] 3 times; hdc in top of ch-3 to join and form last ch-2 space.  
**Rnd 2:** Ch 3, (2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) all over hdc, [ch 1; (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) all in next ch-2 space – corner made] 3 times, ch 1; join with a slip st in top of ch-3. Fasten off **A**.

From this point forward block is worked in rows.

**Row 1:** With right side facing join **B** in 2nd ch of any ch-2; ch 3, 2 dc in same place, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, 3 dc in first ch of next ch-2; turn and leave remaining sts unworked.

**Row 2:** Ch 3, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] twice, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] twice, ch 1, dc in top of ch-3 changing to **C**; turn. Fasten off **B**.

**Row 3:** Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] twice, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] twice, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 space, dc in top of ch-3; turn.

**Row 4:** Ch 3, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 1, dc in top of ch-3 changing to **D**; turn. Fasten off **C**.

**Row 5:** Ch 3, 2 dc in first ch-1 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 3 times, ch 1, 2 dc in next ch-1 space, dc in top of ch-3; turn.

**Row 6:** Ch 3, [ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 4 times, ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch

1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space] 4 times, ch 1, dc in top of ch-3. Fasten off.

**FINISHING:** Following diagram, sew blocks together.

**EDGING-NOTE:** For Rnd 1, "space" refers to ch-3 OR solitary dc at end of a row OR remaining half of ch-2 corner space OR ch-1 space between 3-dc groups on edges of blocks.

**Rnd 1:** With right side facing join A at upper right corner; ch 3, (2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) all in same place, \*\*\* [ch 1, 3 dc in next space] 4 times, \* ch 1, [2 dc in next space] twice, [ch 1, 3 dc in next space] 4 times \*\*; repeat from \* to \*\* 6 more times for top edge; ch 1, corner in next ch-2 space, [ch 1, 3 dc in next space] 4 times; repeat from \* to \*\* 8 times for first long side †, corner in next ch-2 space; repeat from \*\*\* for bottom edge and 2nd side, end at †; join.

**Rnd 2:** Slip st in next 2 dc, slip st in ch-2 space, ch 3, (2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) all in same space, \* ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 space; repeat from \* to corner; (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) all in ch-2 corner space; repeat from \* around; join. Fasten off.

**Rnd 3:** With right side facing, join C in back loop of any st; ch 1, working in back loops sc in each dc and ch around; join. Fasten off.

## Granny Square Crib Afghan

By: Ann Middleman for ADM Marketing,  
Inspired by Redbook

This granny square crib Afghan is a great free crochet pattern. The bright colors will light up the room and make you feel at home. Make this crochet Afghan for your own child or for a grandchild.



### Materials:

- Knitting worsted, 7 oz each of three colors; e.g., bright pink (color A), yellow (color B), purple (color C). Crochet hook, size F or size required for gauge.
- Gauge: Each square measures 3" per side.
- This afghan is made with three sets of granny squares and three sets of crocheted shells in between, with a picot edging.

### Instructions:

**Center Strip:** Make 5 squares as follows:  
With A, ch 6 and join to form center ring.

**Round 1:** Ch 3, work 2dc in ring, (ch 1, 3dc shell in ring) 3 times; ch 1. Join with slip stitch to top of ch 3. Break off.

**Round 2:** With B, slip stitch in any ch 1 space and ch 3. In same space, work 2dc, ch 1, 3dc (first corner). (Ch 1; in next space work 3dc, ch 1, 3dc) three times (3 other corners). Ch 1 and join with slip stitch to top of ch 3; slip stitch in next 2 dc and in ch 1 space.

**Round 3:** Ch 3; in same space work 2dc, ch 1, 3 dc. (Ch 1, 3dc shell in next ch 1 space, ch 1, work corner in next corner space) three times. Ch 1, shell in next ch 1 space, ch 1, join with slip stitch and break off.

Join these squares by whipstitching them together until they form one long strip.

### One-color border around strip:

**Round 1:** Slip stitch with C in a corner space at the beginning of a long side of the finished strip. Work a 1st corner in that space. \*(Ch 1, work shell in next ch 1 space) twice; ch 1, work shell in joining between first two squares.\* Repeat from \* to next corner; ch 1, work corner in that corner space, and continue in that manner around the perimeter of the strip. Join to top of starting ch 3; slip stitch into next 2dc and ch 1 space.

**Round 2 through 7:** Ch 3, work 1st corner in that corner space; continue around as in Round 1. When you have completed Round 7, join with slip stitch and break off.

### Inner border of squares:

Make 24 squares in the same manner as the

Center Strip squares, using color B for Round 1, C for Round 2, and A for Round 3. Join 2 strips of 7 squares each, and 2 strips of 5 squares each, in the same manner as the Center Strip. Using a whipstitch, join the longer strips to the long sides of the One-color border and the shorter strips to the ends. Then whip stitch the corner squares together.

**Two-color border:**

Slip stitch color B to any corner of the [so far] finished work. Work one round, in the same manner as Round 1 of the One-color border. Break off.

Work 5 Rounds in Color A and one more Round in color B. Break off. (7 Rounds altogether)

**Outer border of squares:**

Make 40 squares in the same manner as all the other squares, using color B for Round 1, A for Round 2, and C for Round 3. Join 2 strips of 9 squares each and 2 strips of 11 squares each, in the same manner as above. Whipstitch the strips in the same manner as for the Inner border.

**Finishing:**

Slip stitch with B in any corner space and work two rounds in the same manner as Round 1 of the One-color border. **DO NOT BREAK OFF.**

Ch 4, sc in 4th ch from hook (picot). Sc in each of the next 4 stitches, (work picot, sc in next 4 sts) all around the afghan and join. Break off.

## Granny Square Crochet Afghan

Granny squares are fun crochet projects to help you practice crocheting in the round. Join granny squares to create a colorful throw in this crochet afghan pattern. Granny squares are much easier than they look!



### Materials:

- Yarn: Bernat Satin (3.5 oz/100 g), Main Color (MC) (4143 Lapis) 5 balls, Contrast A (4141 Sapphire) 4 balls, Contrast B (4110 Admiral) 3 balls
- Crochet Hook: Size 5.5 mm (U.S. I or 9) or size needed to obtain gauge.

Gauge: Motif = 4½ ins 11.5 cm square.

Measurement: 40 x 50 ins 101.5 x 127 cm

### Instructions:

Motif (make 99).

With MC, ch 4. Join in ring.

1st rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc. (Ch 2. 3 dc) 3 times in ring. Ch 2. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

2nd rnd: Join A with sl st to any ch 2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same ch 2 sp. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch 2 sp. Rep from twice more. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

3rd rnd: Join MC with sl st to any ch 2 sp. Ch 3 (counts as dc). (2 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in same ch 2 sp. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. (3 dc. Ch 2. 3 dc) in next ch 2 sp. Rep from twice more. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. 1 dc in each of next 3 dc. Ch 1. Miss next 3 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch 3. Fasten off.

4th rnd: Join B with sl st to any ch 2 sp. Ch 1. 3 sc in same sp as last sl st. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 3 sc in next ch 2 sp. Rep from twice more. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

### Joining 2 Motifs

Work 1st to 3rd rnds as given for Motif.

4th rnd: Join B with sl st to any ch 2 sp. Ch 1. 3 sc in same sp as last sl st. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 3 sc in next ch 2 sp. Rep from to once more. (2 sc. Join with sl st to 2nd sc in corner of adjoining motif. 1 sc) all in next ch 2 sp. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. Miss next 4 sc on adjoining motif. Join with sl st to next sc of adjoining motif. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. (1 sc. Join with sl st to 2nd sc in corner of adjoining motif. 2 sc) all in next ch 2 sp. Rep from to once more. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

### Joining 3 Motifs

Work 1st to 3rd rnds as given for Motif.

4th rnd: Join B with sl st to any corner. Ch

1. 3 sc in same sp as sl st. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. (2 sc. Join with sl st to 2nd sc in corner of adjoining motif. 1 sc) all in next ch 2 sp. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. Miss next 4 sc of adjoining motif. Join with sl st to next sc of adjoining motif. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. Rep from to once more. (1 sc. Join with sl st to 2nd sc in corner of adjoining motif. 2 sc) all in next ch 2 sp. (1 sc in each of next 3 dc. 1 sc in next ch 1 sp) twice. 1 sc in each of next 3 dc. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Join Motifs in Throw, having 9 Motifs wide and 11 Motifs long.

Tassel: (make 4). Cut a piece of cardboard 4½ ins 11 cm wide. Wind A around cardboard 30 times. Break yarn leaving a long end and thread end through a needle. Slip needle through all loops and tie tightly. Remove cardboard and wind yarn tightly around loops ¾ inch 2 cm below fold. Fasten securely. Cut through rem loops and trim ends evenly. Sew tassels at each corner of Throw.

## **Purple Delight Granny Square Afghan**

You can continuously make rows to make this afghan as big as you want. You'll love the purple color as it's sure to brighten up any room.
