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Abbreviations

A, B, C: Color A, Color B, Color, C, etc.

Bobble: (Yoh and draw up a loop. Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook) 5 times in next st.

Yoh and draw through all 6 loops on hook

Ch: Chain

Crochet Poncho Patterns for Children

Frutti Toddler Poncho
By: Vickie Howell for Caron

A Frutti Toddler Poncho like this will brighten up your little one's face. Work one up in bright pastels, like these hues from Vickie Howell's Stitch.Rock.Love. Sheep(ish) yarn from Caron. This baby crochet pattern uses three basic stitches making it an easy and quick crochet pattern to work up.



Skill Level: Easy

Size: 12-24 months

Gauge: In pattern stitch, 14 sts x 8 rows = 4" (10 cm)

- Stitch.Rock.Love. Sheep(ish):
 - #0018 Robin Egg(ish) (A, 1 ball)
 - #0021 Lime(ish) (B, 1 ball)
 - #0014 Coral(ish) (C, 1 ball)
 - o #0004 White(ish) (D, 1 ball)
- US size H/8 (5.0 mm) crochet hook
- Stitch markers
- 3" piece of heavy cardboard (or pompom maker)
- Yarn needle



Pattern Notes:

Poncho is worked in joined rounds, with right side facing at all times. Join with a sl st at the end of each round, but do not turn.

Pattern:

Cowl:

With A, ch 60 (66), taking care not to twist ch, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in each remaining ch around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—60 (66) sts. Do not fasten off A. Carry color not in use up inside of piece until next needed.

Rnd 2 (RS): Draw up a loop of B in same ch as join; with B, ch 2, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Do not fasten off B. Carry color not in use up inside of piece until next needed.

Rnd 3 (RS): Draw up a loop of A in same ch as join; with A, ch 3, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Rnds 4-7: Repeat Rounds 2 and 3 twice.

Fasten off A and B.

Body:

Lay cowl flat to find sides. Place one marker on each side, one on left and one on right side with equal amount of space between them on front and back.

Rnd 8 (RS): Draw up a loop of C in same ch as join; with C, ch 3, dc in each st to first marker, 2 dc in marked st, move marker to last dc made, dc in each st to next marker, 2 dc in marked st, move marker to last dc made, dc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—62 (68) sts. Move markers up as each round is completed.

Rnds 9–10 (11): Ch 3, [dc in each st to next marker, 2 dc in marked st] twice, dc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—66 (74) sts. Fasten off C.

Rnd 11 (12): Draw up a loop of B in same ch as join; with B, ch 2, [hdc in each st to next marker, 2 hdc in marked st] twice, hdc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—68 (76) sts. Fasten off B.

Rnds 12 (13): Draw up a loop of A in same ch as join; with A, ch 3, [dc in each st to next marker, 2 dc in marked st] twice, dc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—70 (78) sts.

Rnds 13 (14)–14 (16): With A, repeat Round 9—74 (84) sts. Fasten off A.

Rnd 15 (17): Repeat Round 11 (12)—76 (86) sts. Fasten off B.

Rnds 16 (18): Repeat Round 8—78 (88) sts.



Rnds 17 (19)–19 (23): Ch 3, [dc in each st to next marker, 2 dc in marked st] twice, dc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—84 (96) sts. Fasten off C.

Picot Edging (RS): Draw up a loop of D in same ch as join, *ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (picot made); repeat from * around. Fasten off.

Tie:

With D, make a chain that measures about 43"/109cm, leaving long beginning and ending tails for tying pompoms to end of tie.

Finishing:

Weave tie in and out of base of cowl (Round 7), beginning and ending at front of poncho.

Pompoms (Make 2):

Using D and 3"/7.5cm piece of cardboard, wrap yarn around cardboard about 30 times. Slip wraps off cardboard and tie a piece of yarn tightly around the center of the wraps. Cut both ends of wraps and fluff pompom. Trim.

Using beginning and ending tails of tie, tie one pompom to each end. Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.

Orange Baby Poncho

Use a free crochet baby pattern to make an adorable Orange Baby Poncho. The bright orange color is perfect to wear in the summer, but it's the perfect fall poncho to wear to match the falling leaves and decorated pumpkins. This is an easy crochet pattern to work up and is written up in one size.



Skill Level: Easy

Size: One size to fit baby 12/24 mos. Approx. 27" [68.5 cm] square

Gauge: 13½ dc and 7 rows = 4 ins [10 cm]

Materials:

- Bernat Baby Cakes:
 - o #43650 Punkin' (3 balls)
- US size H/8 (5.0 mm) crochet hook

Pattern Notes:

Poncho is worked in one piece.

Ch 3 at beg of row counts as dc.



Pattern:

Ch 93.

Row 1 (RS): 1 dc in 4th ch from hook. 1 dc in each ch to end of chain. 91 dc. Turn.

Row 2: Ch 3. *1 dc in next dc. Ch 1. Miss next dc. Rep from * to last 2 dc. 1 dc in each of last 2 dc. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 3. *1 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * to last 2 dc. 1 dc in each of last 2 dc. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows until work from beg measures 11½ ins [29 cm], ending with 2nd row. Place marker at each end of last row.

Left Front:

Next row: (RS). Ch 3. (1 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next ch-1 sp) 17 times. 1 dc in next dc. Turn. Leave rem sts unworked.

Next row: Ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 2 dc. *Ch 1. Miss next dc. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from * to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows until work from marked row measures 2 ins [5 cm], ending with a RS row. Fasten off.

Right Front:

(RS). Miss next 19 sts. Join yarn with sl st to next st.

Next row: Ch 3. *1 dc in next ch-1 sp. 1 dc in next dc. Rep from * to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Turn. **Next row:** Ch 3. *1 dc in next dc. Ch 1. Miss next dc. Rep from * to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Turn. Rep last 2 rows until work from marked row measures 2 ins [5 cm], ending with a RS row.

Back:

Joining row: (WS). Ch 3. *1 dc in next dc. Ch 1. Miss next dc. Rep from * to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Ch 19. Working across Left Front sts: 1 dc in next dc. **Ch 1. Miss next dc.

1 dc in next dc. Rep from ** to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Turn.

Place marker at each end of last row.

Next row: Ch 3. *1 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * to ch-19 sp. 1 dc in each of next 19 ch. **1 dc in next dc. 1 dc in next ch-1 sp. Rep from ** to last 2 dc. 1 dc in each of last 2 dc. Turn. 91 dc.

Cont in pat until work from last marked row measures 13½ ins [34.5 cm], ending with a RS row. Fasten off.



Petite Poncho

Get your little one ready for fall with this adorable Petite Poncho. Use any color yarn you want to complete this intermediate crochet pattern — stick with a darker jewel tone to match the colors of the fall season, or go with something brighter or even variegated. Your baby will be warm and fashionable this fall while wearing this adorable poncho. The pattern includes written instructions to crochet the little leaf embellishment, though you can always switch it out for a crochet flower or simply omit it.



Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: 6-12 (12-24) mos

Gauge: 10 sts x 4 rows tr = 4''/10 cm

- Caron International's Simply Soft:
 - o Iris (1 skein)
- US size J/10 (6.0 mm) crochet hook
- US size G/6 (4.0 mm) crochet hook (for embellishment)
- Scraps of worsted weight yarn in yellow & black
- Yarn Needle



Pattern:

With a DOUBLE STRAND of yarn, ch 60 (62) tightly. Taking care not to twist, sl st in first ch to join into a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in next ch and in each ch around. Join with a sl st in top of beginning ch-2—60 (62) hdc.

Rnd 2: Ch 4 (counts as tr here and throughout), tr in each st around. Join with a sl st in top of beginning ch-4.

Rnd 3: Ch 4, tr in each of next 15 sts, 2 tr in next st, tr in next 29 (30), 2 tr in next st, tr in each st around. Join with a sl st in top of beginning ch-4—62 (64) hdc.

Rnds 4-6 (7): Repeat Rnd 2.

Rnd 7 (8): Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in first st (first shell made), *sc in next st, 3 dc in next st (shell made). Repeat from * around, ending with sc in last st. Join with a sl st in top of beginning ch-3—31 (32) shells. Fasten off.

Finishing:

Leaf Embellishment (Make 2):

With a single strand of yellow, worsted-weight yarn, ch 7.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch. Fasten off.

Using yarn needle and yellow yarn, sew leaves on on Rnd 2 of poncho following photo for placement.

Using black yarn and needle, make 3 French Knot berries above leaves. Weave in ends. Block if necessary.





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Winsome Crochet Poncho

Crochet your own diagonally striped crochet poncho with the Winsome Crochet Poncho pattern. This intermediate crochet pattern uses clusters of stitches to achieve the unique stitch pattern seen in the photo. This free crochet pattern teaches you how to make this very lovely stitch as well as how to make this crochet poncho for any size.



Skill Level: Easy

Size: Child size

Gauge: Gauge not listed

Materials:

- Worsted weight yarn in three colors, 1 skein each for child size, 2 skeins each for larger sizes
- US size H/8 (5.0 mm) hook
- US size J/10 (6.0 mm) hook

Pattern Notes:

This stitch is done in multiples of 7 + 2.

The size you are aiming for is equal points from shoulder to how far down you want your point to be when worn.

Ch in multiples of 7 until you reach this desired length, then add plus 2 and you're ready to begin.



Pattern:

Using your J hook, chain your foundation chain – read the pattern notes above.

Row 1: Change to H hook, sc in 2nd ch from hook, skip 2 sts and *{ | YO, insert hook into next stitch and pull up a loop | Repeat this 2 more times giving you 7 loops on your hook. YO and pull through only 6 of the loops leaving the last loop alone. With 2 loops on your hook, YO and pull through last 2 loops and ch 1. Working in the SAME stitch, repeat what is in between the {}s.

Working into the very next chain repeat what you just did. Skip 2 sts and sc into the next st. Ch 1 and skip 2 sts * and repeat what's in between the * for the row. End with a sc in last stitch.

Row 2: Change colors here. Ch 3 and dc into first sc of row. * ch 5 and dc, ch 1, dc (V-Stitch) into next sc * repeat for row. You should end with a dc 1, ch 1, dc 1 (V-Stitch) in last sc.

Row 3: Ch 3 and turn, Work your puff stitches as you did for row 2, only working 2 in this 1st V stitch. * dc into the space between the 4 puff stitches below ch 1 and working in the next V stitch, work all 4 puff stitches into this V stitch.

Repeat for row, * dc, ch 1 into next sc, work your 4 puff sts in V stitch * at end of row work only 2 puff sts just like you did at the beginning of the row.

Row 4: Change colors here. Ch 5 and DC, ch 1, DC in next DC, * ch 5 and dc, ch, dc into next dc. * repeat what's in between *s for row. To end row ch 3 and dc in top of ch 3.

Row 5: Ch 3 and work your * 4 puff sts into the V stitch, dc into the space between the 4 puff stitches below, ch 1 * repeat for row. To end row dc into the 3rd ch of the ch 5.

Row 6: Change colors and ch 3 and dc into same st, * ch 5 and dc, ch 1, dc into next dc, * repeat for row. End your row with a V stitch. Repeat rows 3-6 until you reach the length you want.

To find out how many to chain for the smaller piece, take the piece you just made and fold it in half. Then fold it in half again. This is the size you will need to make for your smaller piece.

Each puff shell and the following dc take up the multiple of 7. So 4 puff shells gives 28 sts - don't forget your plus 2 before starting! Chain with your larger hook like before, then switch to your smaller one. Make this piece as many rows as you made your larger piece. Hide all tails.

Then lay out your pieces and fold them both in half and line them up together.

Turn your work with the back side facing you so that your sewing won't show, line up the two pieces and sc them together (or any method of sewing you prefer).

To Make the Neck Hole Smaller:

Row 1: Sc in all sts around for your first row. Sl st in beg st.

Row 2: Ch 1 and sc into the same st, sc in 2 stitches then do a sc dec. SI st in beg st.

Row 3: Ch 1 and sc into the same st, sc dec, *sc 1, sc dec, * repeat for round. Sl st in beg st.

Row 4: Sc in all sts, sl st in beg st, ch 1 and cut your yarn.



Crochet Poncho Patterns for Adults

Scarlett Spiral Crochet Poncho

The Scarlett Spiral Crochet Poncho is a lovely addition to anyone's crochet wardrobe. Light and airy, this free crochet poncho pattern is customizable to any size! It is worked in the round, and as you crochet you can see the spiral pattern develop before your eyes. Ponchos are great because they are flattering on practically any body type, and this one is no different. You will look and feel like a million bucks every time you wear this Scarlett Spiral Crochet Poncho.



Skill Level: Easy

Size: One size

Gauge: Gauge not critical

- Red Heart With Love:
 - Merlot (2 skeins)
- US size K/10.5 (6.5 mm) hook
- Tapestry needle



Pattern Notes:

If you would like to use a different yarn or hook size, you will need to determine the correct number of chains to begin. To determine your number of starting chains, you will need to measure the distance from one shoulder to the other and double that distance. Your starting chain should be that length and follow the multiple of 8 + 1 rule for the beginning chain.

For rows 2-8, the chain 2 does NOT count as an HDC. At the end of each of the first 8 rows, join to the top of the first stitch and continue in the round.

Pattern:

Chain 81, slip stitch to join. Be careful not to twist.

Row 1: Chain 1, sc in the same stitch and in each stitch around, slip stitch to join in the top of the first sc. (80 sc)

Row 2: Ch 2, hdc in same stitch and in each stitch around, slip stitch to join. (80 hdc)

Row 3: Ch 2, 2 hdc in the same stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 9 stitches. *2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 9 stitches. * Repeat from * to * around. Slip stitch to join. (88 hdc)

Row 4: Ch 2, 2 hdc in the same stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 10 stitches. *2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 10 stitches.* Repeat from * to * around. Join to top of first hdc. (96 hdc)

Row 5: Ch 2, 2 hdc in the same stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 11 stitches. *2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 11 stitches. * Repeat from * to * around. Join to top of first hdc. (104 hdc)

Row 6: Ch 2, 2 hdc in the same stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 12 stitches. *2 hdc in the next stitch, 1 hdc in each of the next 12 stitches.* Repeat from * to * around. Join to top of first hdc. (112 hdc)

Rows 7-8: Ch 2, 1 hdc in each stitch around. (112 stitches) *Note this row MUST be a multiple of 8 stitches. If you see that you need to continue to increase, make sure that you only increase 8 stitches total per row.

Begin the Trellis:

The trellis is crocheted in the round, so when you come back to the first chain 3, you will continue the pattern into row 2 of the trellis.

Trellis Row 1: *Chain 3, skip 2 stitches, sc in the next stitch, chain 3, skip 2 stitches, 3 dc in the next stitch.* Repeat from * to * around. The last set of stitches in the first row of the trellis will be a chain 3. You will still have two stitches between the last sc and the beginning chain 3. Continue the pattern by crocheting 3 dc in the beginning chain 3.

From that point forward, continue with this pattern: *Chain 3, sc in the top of first dc in the next 3 dc cluster. Chain 3, 3 dc in the next chain 3 space. * Repeat from * to *.

Continue the spiral trellis pattern until your piece has 20-24 rows of trellis. If you would like, you can continue longer than this, but 20-24 rows will result in a piece that ends just below your elbows. End with a sc in the top of the first dc of a 3 dc cluster and a slip stitch in the second dc. Fasten off and weave in ends.



Cozy Tweed Crochet Poncho

Throw on something irresistibly warm with the Cozy Tweed Crochet Poncho. You can pull this poncho over just about anything: a t-shirt, long sleeve shirt, a lightweight sweater, or whatever you desire. The buttons that divide the outsides into armholes make this poncho almost like a sweater and the cowl neck makes it fall and winter friendly. What we do know about this crochet pattern is that you'll be warm in all your layers!



Skill Level: Easy

Size: XS/M (L/2XL, 3/5 XL) to fit bust size 28-38" [71-96.5 cm] (40-48" [101.5-122 cm], 52-62" [132-157.5 cm])

Gauge: 9 sts and 11 rows = 4" (10 cm) in Texture Pat with smaller hook

- Patons Colorwul:
 - #90013 Bramble (20 (22, 25) balls)
- US size L/11 (8.0 mm) hook
- US size N/13 (9.0 mm) hook
- Stitch markers
- Two 1" (2.5 cm) buttons



Pattern Notes:

Garment is worked in one piece.

Ch 2 at beg of row does not count as hdc.

Pattern:

With smaller hook, beg at lower Back edge, ch 103 (107, 111).

Row 1 (WS): 1 dc in 4th ch from hook (counts as 2 dc). 1 dc in each ch to end of chain. Turn. 101 (105, 107) dc.

Row 2: Ch 2. 1 hdc in first dc. *1 dcfp around post of next st. 1 hdc in next st. Rep from * to end of row, working last hdc in top of turning ch 3. Turn.

Row 3: Ch 2. 1 hdc in first hdc. *1 dcbp around post of next dcfp. 1 hdc in next hdc. Rep from * to end of row. Turn.

Row 4: Ch 2. 1 hdc in first hdc. *1 dcfp around post of next dcbp. 1 hdc in next hdc. Rep from * to end of row. Turn.

Rep 3rd and 4th rows for rib pat until work from beg measures 8" [20.5 cm], ending on a WS row. Fasten off. Note: When working Texture Pat below, take care to not work sl sts too tightly.

Next row: (RS). Skip first 11 sts. Join yarn with sl st to next st. Ch 2. 1 hdc in same sp as last sl st. *Sl st in next st. 1 hdc in next st. Rep from * to last 11 sts. Turn. Leave rem sts unworked.

Cont on 79 (83, 87) sts as follows:

Next row: Ch 1. Sl st in first hdc. *1 hdc in next sl st. Sl st in next hdc. Rep from * to end of row. Turn.

Next row: Ch 2. 1 hdc in first sl st. *Sl st in next hdc. 1 hdc in next sl st. Rep from * to end of row. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows for Texture Pat until work from beg measures 28 (28, 29)" [71 (71, 73.5) cm], ending on a WS row.

Shape Neck:

Right Side: 1st row: (RS). Ch 2. 1 hdc in first sl st. (Sl st in next hdc. 1 hdc in next sl st) 14 (15, 16) times (neck edge). Sl st in next hdc. Turn. Leave rem sts unworked.

2nd row: Ch 1. Sc2tog. Pat to end of row. Turn. 29 (31, 33) sts. PM at end of row for shoulder.

3rd to 6th rows: Work even in pat.

7th row: (RS). Pat to last st. (1 hdc. Sl st) in last st. Turn.



8th row: Ch 1. (Sl st. 1 hdc) in first sl st. Pat to end for row. 31 (33, 35) sts. Do not fasten off. Leave safety pin or pull long loop on last st to prevent unraveling.

Left Side: 1st row: (RS). Skip center back 19 sts. Join 2nd ball of yarn (taking care to match color section of striping repeat in ball) with sl st to next hdc. *1 hdc in next sl st. Sl st in next hdc. Rep from * to last st. 1 hdc in last sl st. Turn.

2nd row: Pat to last 2 sts. Sc2tog. Turn. 29 (31, 33) sts. PM at beg of row for shoulder.

3rd to 6th rows: Work even in pat.

7th row: (RS). Ch 1. (1 hdc. SI st) in first st. Pat to end of row. Turn.

8th row: Pat to last st. (Sl st. 1 hdc) in last st. 31 (33, 35) sts. Ch 17 for center front neck. Fasten

off.

Join Sides: Next row: (RS). Return loop from first ball of Right Side back onto hook. Ch 2. 1 hdc in first sl st. (Sl st in next hdc. 1 hdc in next sl st) 15 (16, 17) times. (Sl st in next ch. 1 hdc in next ch) 8 times. Sl st in next ch. Pat across Left Side. Turn. 79 (83, 87) sts.

Cont even in Texture Pat until work from shoulder markers measures 20 (20, 21)" [51 (51, 53.5) cm], ending on a WS row. Fasten off.

Right Rib Edging: 1st row: (RS). Join yarn with sl st to first skipped st at right back edge. Ch 2. 1 hdc in same sp as last sl st. (1 dcfp around post of next dcbp. 1 hdc in next hdc) 5 times. Turn. 11 sts.

2nd row: Ch 2. 1 hdc in first hdc. (1 dcbp around post of next dcfp. 1 hdc in next hdc) 5 times. Turn.

Rep last 2 rows until Rib Edging measures length to fit along side edge of Poncho (when slightly stretched), ending on a WS row. Do not fasten off. Leave safety pin or pull long loop on last st to prevent unraveling.

Left Rib Edging: With 2nd ball of yarn work as for Right Rib Edging along left side. Fasten off. Sew Right and Left Rib Edgings into position up sides of Poncho.

Lower Front Edging: 1st row: (RS). Return loop from first ball of Right Rib Edging back onto hook. Ch 2. 1 hdc in first hdc. (1 dcfp around post of next dcbp. 1 hdc in next hdc) 5 times. *1 dcfp around post of next hdc. 1 hdc in next sl st. Rep from * across lower edge of Front of Poncho to last st. 1 dcfp around post of last hdc. Working across Left Rib Edging: (1 hdc in next hdc. 1 dcfp around post of next dcbp) 5 times. 1 hdc in last hdc. Turn. 101 (105, 109) sts.

Cont in rib pat for 8" [20.5 cm] to match Back, ending on a WS row. Fasten off.



Collar: **1st rnd**: (RS). With larger hook, join yarn with sl st in center st of back neck edge. Ch 2. Work 60 hdc evenly around neck edge. Join with sl st to first hdc.


2nd rnd: Ch 2. 1 hdc in same st as last sl st. *1 dcfp around post of next hdc. 1 hdc in next hdc. Rep from * to last hdc. 1 dcfp around post of last hdc. Join with sl st to first hdc.

3rd rnd: Ch 2. 1 hdc in same st as last sl st. *1 dcfp around post of next dcfp. 1 hdc in next hdc. Rep from * to last dcfp. 1 dcfp around post of last dcfp. Join with sl st to first hdc.

Rep last rnd until Collar measures 9" [23 cm]. Fasten off.

Finishing:

Try on Poncho and mark position for buttons at each side edge. Sew buttons through all thicknesses.





Cozy Cowl Poncho
By: Lion Brand

Stay warm and toasty this winter with this Cozy Cowl Poncho. Use Lion Brand variegated yarn to work up this easy crochet poncho pattern - choose your shade and work up your own work of art that weaves in and out of various color hues. The cowl neckline makes this one of the most trendy crochet poncho patterns ever and will definitely keep you cozy without sacrificing a bit of style this season. Bulky yarn makes this a quick crochet pattern to work up. This crochet poncho pattern is available in one size only and measures about 22 inches by 25 inches.



Skill Level: Easy

Size: One size; 22 x 25" (56 x 63.5 cm) after folding

Gauge: 5 hdc = about 4" (10 cm)

- Lion Brand Homespun Thick and Quick Yarn
 - o #792-207 Greystone Stripes (3 balls)
- US size P/15 (10.0 mm) hook
- Yarn needle



Pattern:

Ch 30.

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across - 28 sts.

Row 2: Ch 2 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc in each st across. Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 50 in (127 cm) from beg. Fasten off.

Fold piece in half lengthwise, bringing first row to meet last row. The folded piece should measure about 22×25 in $(56 \times 63.5 \text{ cm})$. Beg at a corner and following diagram, sl st side edges together for 13 in (33 cm), leaving 12 in (30.5 cm) open for neck. Do not fasten off, but continue on for cowl neck.

Cowl Neck:

Rnd 1 (Right Side): Continuing with same strand of yarn, ch 2, work 30 hdc evenly spaced around neck opening; join with sl st in top of beg ch.


Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

Rep Rnd 2 until cowl measures about 8 in (20.5 cm).

Last Rnd: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Finishing:

Weave in ends.





Mosaic Sunset Poncho

By: Tammy Hildebrand for Red Heart Yarns

Use lightweight Heart and Sole yarn by Red Heart to complete this colorful Mosaic Sunset Poncho. This intermediate crochet pattern is worth every stitch because it looks so stylish and trendy. It's definitely a pattern worth making if you're looking for a bright piece of clothing to wear this spring. This is a great pattern to add to your wardrobe for the spring and summer months because of the beautiful color and trendy style.



Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: S/M (L/XL, XXL/XXXL) to fit bust 32-40 (40-46, 48-54)" [81-97 (102-117, 122-137) cm]; Finished center panel width 11 (13, 15)" [28 (33, 38) cm]; Finished length 27" (69 cm) at longest point

Gauge: 20 dc = 4'' (10 cm), 3 sc x 2 shell in lace pattern = 5'' (12.7 cm); 4 rows sc x 3 rows dc = 4'' (10 cm) blocked

- Red Heart Heart & Sole:
 - #3960 Spring Stripe (5 (6, 7) balls)
- US size I/9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook
- Yarn needle



Pattern Notes:

Poncho is made with 2 center panels and 2 long sleeve panels.

The first half of each long sleeve panel is worked up to Row 41 and fastened off. The second half is worked in the bottom of Row 1 from first half.

Pattern:

Center Panel (Make 2):

Ch 49 (59, 69).

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next 2 [7, 12] chs, skip next 3 chs, half sh in next ch, [skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, sh in next ch] 3 times, skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, half sh in next ch, skip next 3 chs, dc in last 4 (9, 14) chs – 8 (18, 28) dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 3 sh.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 5 (10, 15) dc, [ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh] 3 times, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next 2 dc, sc in last 5 (10, 15) dc – 17 (27, 37) sc, 8 ch-5 spaces.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] 4 times, sc in next sc, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 5 sc, 4 sh.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 5 (10 15) sts, [ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh, ch 5, sc in next sc] 4 times, sc in last 4 (9, 14) dc - 17 (27, 37) sc, 8 ch-5 spaces.

Row 5: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, half sh in next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] 3 times, sc in next sc, ch 1, half sh in next ch, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 3 sh.

Rows 6-21: Repeat Rows 2-5, four times.

Rows 22-24: Repeat Rows 2-4 once.

Row 25: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, half sh in next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, shell in next sc, sc in next sc, ch 2, ([tr, ch 2] 5 times) in next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, half sh in next sc, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 2 sh, 5 tr.

Row 26: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 5 (10, 15) dc, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh, ch 5, sc in next sc, [ch 5, skip next tr, sc in next tr] 2 times, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next 2 dc, sc in last 5 (10, 15) dc – 18 (28, 38) sc, 9 ch-5 spaces.

Row 27: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, [sh in next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1] twice, sh in next ch-5 space, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] twice, sc in next sc, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 6 sc, 5 sh.

Row 28: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 5 (10 15) sts, [ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh, ch 5, sc in next sc] 5 times, sc in last 4 (9, 14) dc – 19 (29, 39) sc, 10 ch-5 spaces.



Row 29: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, half sh in next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] 4 times, sc in next sc, ch 1, half sh in next sc, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 2 half sh, 5 sc, 4 sh.

Row 30: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 5 (10, 15) dc, [ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh] 4 times, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next 2 dc, sc in last 5 (10, 15) dc – 19 (29, 39) sc, 10 ch-5 spaces.

Row 31: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 3 (8, 13) sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] twice, sc in next sc, ch 3, (tr [ch 2, tr] 4 times) in next sc, ch 3, sc in next sc, [ch 1, sh in next sc, sc in next sc] twice, dc in last 4 (9, 14) sc - 8 (18, 28) dc, 6 sc, 4 sh, 5 tr.

Edging:

Side 1: Ch 1, pivot to work over post of st at each row end; work sc in each sc row end and 2 sc in each dc row end across. Fasten off.

Side 2: With Right Side facing, join yarn with sc in Row 1 on opposite side of panel, sc in same space; work sc in each sc row end and 2 sc in each dc row end across. Fasten off.

Sleeve Panel (Make 2):

First Half:

Ch 69.

Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in next 12 chs, skip next 3 chs, half-sh in next ch, [skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, sh in next ch] 3 times, skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, half-sh in next ch, skip next 3 chs, dc in last 14 chs – 28 dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 3 sh.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 15 dc, [ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh] 3 times, ch 5, sc in next sc, ch 5, skip next 2 dc, sc in last 15 dc – 37 sc, 8 ch-5 sps.

Row 3: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 13 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] 4 times, sc in next sc, dc in last 14 sc - 28 dc, 5 sc, 4 sh.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn; sc in first 15 sts, [ch 5, sc in center dc of next sh, ch 5, sc in next sc] 4 times, sc in last 14 dc – 37 sc, 8 ch-5 spaces.

Row 5: Ch 3, turn; dc in next 13 sc, half-sh in next sc, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sh in next sc] 3 times, sc in next sc, ch 1, half-sh in next ch, dc in last 14 sc – 28 dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 3 sh.

Rows 6-41: Repeat Rows 2-5, nine times. Fasten off after last row.



Second Half:

Row 1: Working in bottom loops of Row 1 on first half of sleeve panel, join yarn with slip st in first loop, ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in next 13 chs, skip next 3 chs, half sh in next ch, [skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, sh in next ch] 3 times, skip next 3 chs, sc in next ch, ch 1, skip next 3 chs, halfsh in next ch, skip next 3 chs, dc in last 14 chs – 28 dc, 2 half sh, 4 sc, 3 sh.

Rows 2-41: Repeat Rows 2-5 for First Half, ten times.

Edging:

Repeat Edging for Center Panel.

Assembly:

With Wrong Sides facing together, align stitches of Edging on Center Panel with Sleeve Panel keeping center peak pointing outward; working through both thicknesses, join yarn with slip st in first st, ch 1, *slip st in next st, ch 1; repeat from * to end. Repeat for opposite side of same Center Panel to join second Sleeve Panel. Repeat to join second Center Panel to opposite end of each Sleeve Panel.

Neck and Shoulder Shaping:

Rnd 1: With RS facing, join yarn with sc in seam at right side, *working in bottom loops of Row 1 on Center Panel, dc in first 4 (9, 14) chs, [skip next 3 chs, 2 dc in next ch] 9 times, skip next 3 chs, dc in next 4 (9, 14) chs, sc in center of next seam, working in sts of edging on Sleeve Panel, sc2tog across*, sc in center of next seam; repeat from * to *; join with slip st in first st.


Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in first st, *sc2tog 13 (18, 23) times, sc in each st up to next Center Panel; repeat from * to end; join with slip st in first st.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in each st around; join with slip st in top of beginning ch-3.

Rnds 4-6: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with slip st in first st. Fasten off after last round.

Finishing:

Weave in ends. Wet block to measurements





Oversized Lean Poncho By: Dee Neer for Caron

Keep the warmth going all year long with this Oversized Lean Poncho crochet pattern. With a crochet wearable that is good for any season, there is no reason not to work up this poncho pattern. The length gives you a lean and flattering style to complement any look and complete your wardrobe. There are even different sizes if you want it to fit just a little bit shorter or longer. Ponchos are a great way to add just a little bit of both warmth and style when you're on the go, at work, or curling up on the couch at home.



Skill Level: Beginner

Size: XS/S (M, L/XL); Length including scalloped edge 18 (20, 22)"; Lower edge 72 (80, 88)"

Gauge: In St patt: 10 sts and 6 rows = 4" (10 cm); Scallops measure approx 4" wide x 3" deep

- Caron International Simply Soft:
 - o #9742 Grey Heather (3, (3, 3) skeins)
 - o #9703 Bone (3, (3, 3) skeins)
- US size K/10.5 (6.5 mm) hook
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch markers (optional)



Pattern Notes:

Poncho is worked from the lower edge to upper edge as a large rectangle; the scalloped edging is worked after Poncho is sewn together. There is actually no Back or Front to this Poncho – it may be worn with the pointed end in Back or in Front for 2 entirely different looks. References to Back and Front are for clarification of the instructions only.

Pattern:

Row 1: Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), * skip next 2 dc, work 2 dc in next ch-1 space (cluster made), ch 1; repeat from * across, end dc in top of beginning ch, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in ch-1 space, * ch 1, skip next 2 dc, work 2 dc in next ch-1 space; repeat from * across, turn.

Fan Pattern (multiple of 10 sts; 3-rows):

Foundation Row: Beginning approx 2" from center Back point (corner of short edge and long edge which hangs down), join yarn with a sl st, ch 1, work 5 sc to corner, ch 1, then working into corner st a second time, sc around, join with a sl st to beginning ch; work 133 (150, 166) sc along long edge of original piece, work 26 (29, 33) sts total along short end—160 (180, 200) sts, with the ch-1 at corner being the center of the first fan.

Row 1: Ch 1, skip first sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 1, skip 1 sc, work 5 dc in corner ch-1 (fan made), * ch 1, skip 1 sc, sc in next 7 sc, ch 1, skip 1 sc, work 5 dc in next sc (fan); repeat from * around, end ch 1, skip 1 sc, sc to beginning of rnd, join with sl st to beginning ch.

Row 2: Ch 1, skip first sc, sc in next sc, * ch 2, skip next [2 sc, ch-1], work 2 dc in each dc of fan, ch 2, skip next [ch-1, 2 sc], sc in next 3 sc; repeat from * around, end last repeat ch 2, skip next [ch-1, 2 sc], join with a sl st to beginning ch.

Row 3: Ch 3, skip next [sc, ch-2], * in fan, work [* 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc; repeat from * around fan], ch 3, skip next [ch-2, sc], sc in next sc, ch 3, skip next [sc, ch-2]; repeat from * around, end last repeat ch 3, sl st in beginning ch. Fasten off.

Poncho:

Loosely ch 136 (154, 169).

Foundation Row: Beginning in 4th ch from hook, dc in next ch, ch 1, skip 1 ch, dc in next 2 ch; repeat from * across, end dc in last 2 ch—134 (152, 167) sts, turn.

Begin 2×1 Cluster Stitch; work even until piece measures 18 (20, 22)" from the beginning. Fasten off.



Finishing:


Referring to schematic and Diagram, measure along lower edge 18 (20, 22)"; place a marker (pm). Fold piece, matching points Y to Y and Z to Z; neatly sew seam.

Neck Edging: Row 1: Beginning at lower edge of V-neck (center Back), join yarn, ch 1, work 1 row sc evenly around neck edge, join with a sl st to beginning ch. DO NOT TURN.

Row 2: Working from left to right, work 1 row rev sc evenly around neck. Fasten off.

Lower Edging: Work Foundation Row of Fan patt, working 160 (180, 200) sc around entire lower edge.

Work Rows 1-3 of Fan patt once. Fasten off. Weave in ends.





Holiday Poncho

By: Jessie Rayot from Jessie at Home

The Holiday Poncho is great for cold evenings out and about, or even at home. It will work wonderfully in the colors listed for Valentine's Day as well. The chunky crocheting and fringe are right in line with the current style; you will be the envy of the Holiday Party!



Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: One size fits most

Gauge: 8 sts x 5 rows = 4" [10 cm] in dc using 2 strands of yarn

- Red Heart With Love:
 - o #1915 Merlot (A, 2 skeins)
 - o #1914 Berry Red (B, 2 skeins)
 - o #1909 Holly Berry (C, 2 skeins)
 - #1701 Hot Pink (D, 2 skeins)
 - o #1704 Bubble Gum (E, 2 skeins)
 - o #1101 Eggshell (F, 2 skeins)
 - o #1621 Evergreen (G, 2 skeins)
 - #1601 Lettuce (H, 2 skeins)
- US size N/13 (9.0 mm) hook
- Yarn needle



Pattern Notes:

Throughout the pattern, hold 2 strands of yarn together as one.

Pattern:

Top Sections (Make 2):

Row 1: With A and A, ch 24, dc in 4th st from hook (the last 3 chs made count as first dc), dc in each remaining ch. (24 dc)

Rows 2-3: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in each remaining st across. (24 dc)

Repeat row 2, three times with A and B.

Repeat row 2, three times with B and B.

Repeat row 2, three times with B and C.

Repeat row 2, three times with C and C.

Repeat row 2, three times with C and D.


Repeat row 2, three times with D and D.

Repeat row 2, three times with D and E.

Repeat row 2, three times with E and E.

Finish off and weave in all ends.

Sew two top sections together as indicated in picture below, joining yellow to yellow and orange to orange:





Border:

Rnd 1: Join 2 strands of Color F to one of the bottom points of poncho, ch 6 (counts as dc, ch 3 here and throughout), (dc, ch 1, dc) in same sp, (dc, ch 1, dc) in side of each dc to seam, skip 1, *(dc, ch 1, dc) in next st, skip 1; repeat from * to next corner, (dc, ch 1, dc, ch 3, dc, ch 1, dc) in corner, (dc, ch 1, dc) in side of each dc to seam, skip 1, **(dc, ch 1, dc) in next st, skip 1; repeat from ** to corner, dc, ch 1, sl st to 3rd ch of beginning ch 6, sl st into ch-3 sp.

Rnd 2: Ch 6, (dc, ch 1, dc) in same sp, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each ch-1 sp to corner, (dc, ch 1, dc, ch 3, dc, ch 1, dc) in ch-3 corner, (dc, ch 1, dc) in each ch-1 sp to corner, (dc, ch 1) in ch-3 corner, sl st to 3rd ch of beginning ch 6, sl st into ch-3 sp.

Repeat row 2, two times with F and G.

Repeat row 2, two times with G and G.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Finishing:

Cut tassels from Colors G and H (I used a dvd case to wrap mine). Use 3 strands of each color for each tassel and attach a tassel to each ch-1 and ch-3 space at the bottom of the poncho.

Wear or give and enjoy!
