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Cute Crochet Hat Patterns

Cozy Snowman Hat

Kids will go crazy over this adorable Cozy Snowman Hat. Bulky yarn is used to complete this free crochet hat pattern, which means it works up quickly and is super warm to wear. Worsted weight yarn is used for the earflaps, tails, pom poms and nose. This would be an excellent crochet pattern to make for all the kids on your Christmas list.

Crochet Hook: I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (5) Bulky/Chunky (12-15 stitches for 4 inches)

Materials:

- White Chunky Yarn
- Worsted Weight Yarn in an accent color (like red) and black for the top hat
- Size I hook
- Tapestry Needle
- Poly-fil
- Two medium/large size buttons (about 1")
- 5 small buttons for the mouth

Abbreviations:

st = stitch

ch = chain

sl st = slip stitch

SC = Single Crochet

DC = Double Crochet (This is the American English Double Crochet Stitch! Which is different than the British English Double Crochet Stitch. Please make sure you are using the correct stitch.)

SC decrease = Single Crochet decrease

Size: 0-3 Months

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next four, join, ch 1 (36 DC)

Round 5-7: DC around (36 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 8: SC around (36 SC)
do not fasten off, start on earflap

Size: 3-6 Months

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next two, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Round 5-8: DC around, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 9: SC around, join, ch 1 (40 SC)
do not fasten off, start on earflap

Size: 6-12 Months

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next two, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Round 5: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next seven, join, ch 2 (45 DC)

Round 6-9: DC around, join, ch 2 (45 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 10: SC around, join, ch 1 (45 SC)

do not fasten off, start on earflap

Size: Preschooler

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next two, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Round 5: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next three, join, ch 2 (50 DC)

Round 6-10: DC around, join, ch 2 (50 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 11: SC around, join, ch 1 (50 SC)

do not fasten off, start on earflap

Note: I made one extra round of SC's on the hat for my son (the blue hat pictured). You may want make 1-2 extra rounds at the bottom on the larger hats.

Size: Child

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next two, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Round 5: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next three, join, ch 2 (50 DC)

Round 6: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next 9, join, ch 2 (55 DC)

Round 7-11: DC around (55 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 12: SC around (55 SC)

do not fasten off, start on earflap

Size: Teen/Adult

Magic ring, chain 2, DC 10 in magic ring, join to first DC, ch 2

Round 2: 2 DC in each around, join, ch 2 (20 DC)

Round 3: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next, around, join, ch 2. (30 DC)

Round 4: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next two, join, ch 2 (40 DC)

Round 5: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next three, join, ch 2 (50 DC)

Round 6: 2 DC in first stitch, DC in next four, join, ch 2 (60 DC)

Round 7-12: DC around (60 DC)

Change color (now use regular worsted weight yarn)

Round 13: SC around (60 SC)
do not fasten off, start on earflap

Earflaps for 0-3 months - Preschooler

Earflap 1:

Chain 1, SC in next 10, chain 1, turn

Row 2: SC decrease, SC in next 6, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 3: SC across (8 SC)

Row 4: SC decrease, SC in next 4, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 5: SC across (6 SC)

Row 6: SC decrease, SC in next 2, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 7: SC across (4 SC)

Row 8: Make 2 SC decreases, chain 1, turn

Row 9: SC decrease, fasten off, weave in ends

Earflap 2:

Leave 9 stitches in front for newborn, 12 stitches for 0-3 months, 15 for 3-6 months, 19 for Preschooler,

Chain 1, SC in next 10, chain 1, turn

Row 2: SC decrease, SC in next 6, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 3: SC across (8 SC)

Row 4: SC decrease, SC in next 4, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 5: SC across (6 SC)

Row 6: SC decrease, SC in next 2, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 7: SC across (4 SC)

Row 8: Make 2 SC decreases, chain 1, turn

Row 9: SC decrease, chain 40 or as long/short as you wish, slip stitch in 4th chain from hook and the rest of the way down the chain. When you reach the earflap, continue to SC around. When you get around the point of the other earflap, chain 40 or as long/short as you wish, slip stitch in 4th chain from hook and the rest of the way down. When you get back to the earflap, continue to SC around

until you are back to where you started. fasten off and weave in ends.

Earflaps for Child - Adult

Earflap 1:

Chain 1, SC in next 12, chain 1, turn

Row 2: SC decrease, SC in next 8, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 3: SC across (10 SC)

Row 4: SC decrease, SC in next 6, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 5: SC across (8 SC)

Row 6: SC decrease, SC in next 4, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 7: SC across (6 SC)

Row 8: SC decrease, SC in next 2, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 9: SC across (4 SC)

Row 10: Make 2 SC decreases, chain 1, turn

Row 11: SC decrease, fasten off, weave in ends

Earflap 2:

Leave 22 stitches in front for Child, 25 stitches for adult

Chain 1, SC in next 12, chain 1, turn

Row 2: SC decrease, SC in next 8, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 3: SC across (10 SC)

Row 4: SC decrease, SC in next 6, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 5: SC across (8 SC)

Row 6: SC decrease, SC in next 4, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 7: SC across (6 SC)

Row 8: SC decrease, SC in next 2, SC decrease, chain 1, turn

Row 9: SC across (4 SC)

Row 10: Make 2 SC decreases, chain 1, turn

Row 11: SC decrease, chain 40 or as long/short as you wish, slip stitch in 4th chain from hook and the rest of the way down the chain. When you reach the earflap, continue to SC around. When you get around the point of the other earflap, chain 40 or as long/short as you wish, slip stitch in 4th chain from hook and the rest of the way down. When you get back to

the earflap, continue to SC around until you are back to where you started. fasten off and weave in ends.

Make two yarn pom poms, attach the pom pom to the bottom of the tails. Make sure they are secure by knotting them a couple of times. Trim ends to match the length of the yarn in the pom pom.



Snowman Top Hat:

use size H hook for small hats and size I or J hook for larger hats

Magic ring, SC 10, join, ch 1

Round 2: 2 SC in each stitch around, join, ch 1 (20 SC)

Round 3: 2 SC in first stitch, SC in next, around, join, ch 1 (30 SC)

Round 4: In back loops only, SC around, join, ch 1 (30 SC)

Round 5: Now working in both loops, SC in next 8, SC decrease, repeat around, join, ch 1

Round 6: SC around, join, ch 1 (27 SC)

Round 7: SC in next 7, SC decrease, repeat around, join, ch 1.

Round 8: SC around, join, ch 1 (24 SC)
Change color for rounds 9 and 10 if you want to make a stripe in your hat

Round 9: SC in next 6, SC decrease, repeat around, join, ch 1

Round 10: SC around, join, ch 1 (21 SC)

Round 11: In front loops only, SC around, join, ch 1 (21 SC)

Round 12: Now working in both loops, 2 SC in each around, join, fasten off and weave in ends (42 SC)

Stuff with poly-fil and sew onto top of beanie at an angle. Using your tapestry needle and with black yarn, sew hat on at the point where brim begins.



Carrot Nose:

Chain 6, Sl St in second chain from hook, SC, HDC, DC, DC, continue to slip stitch around the back and bottom of the triangle, when you get to the tip, chain 2, slip stitch in second chain from hook and slip stitch to your first SC.



Snowy Ridges

This hat is a beautiful crochet pattern. A J crochet hook enables you to make this great pattern easily using worsted weight yarn. This is perfect for the holiday season or a Sunday morning in church.

Crochet Hook: J/10 or 6 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

MATERIALS:

- Lion Brand Wool-Ease White Frost, 2.5 ounces
- J (6.0 mm) crochet hook
- Worsted weight yarn, small amounts of red and green

- G (4.05 mm) crochet hook
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 6 dc = 2 inches

SIZE: Women's Small and average

NOTES:

1. Read instructions all the way through before beginning.
2. Pull slipstitches tight, you want them to almost disappear.
3. Beginning chains do not count as a stitch in rounds 1-5.
4. Blue hat made with Red Heart Super Saver.

SPECIAL STITCH:

Picot = Ch 3, slipstitch in 3rd ch from hook.

CAP INSTRUCTIONS:

With Wool-Ease and J hook.

Round 1: Ch 3, doesn't count as first st, 12 dc in 3rd ch from hook. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (12 dc)

Round 2: Ch 2, 2 dc in each st. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (24 dc)

Round 3: Ch 2, *dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (36 dc)

Round 4: Ch 2, *dc in 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (48 dc)

Round 5 average only: Ch 2, *dc in 3 sts, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (60 dc)

Round 5 small only: Ch 2, *dc in 7 sts, 2 dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in first dc. (54 dc)

Rounds 6-14 average only: Ch 3, does count as first st, *fpdc around next st, dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in top of ch 3. (60 sts)

Rounds 6-13 small only: Ch 3, does count as first st, *fpdc around next st, dc in next st, repeat from * around. Join with a slipstitch in top of ch 3. (54 sts)

Rounds 15-17 average only: Ch 1, sc in each st. Join with a slipstitch in first sc. (60 sc)

Rounds 14-16 small only: Ch 1, sc in

each st. Join with a slipstitch in first sc. (54 sc)

Finish off and weave in ends.

HOLLY EMBELLISHMENT INSTRUCTIONS:

MATERIALS:

Worsted eight yarn
G (4.5 mm) crochet hook
Yarn needle

NOTES:

1. Read instructions all the way through before beginning.
2. Leaves and berries maybe worked with any size yarn or thread, just use the appropriate size hook for the yarn.
3. Leaf stitches are worked by inserting hook under two loops of the chain. When you work in the unused loop of chain there will only be a single loop. That's why you work over the tail to make it match the first side.

SPECIAL STITCH:

Picot = Ch 3, slipstitch in 3rd ch from hook.

HOLLY LEAF (make 2)

Round 1: Ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, *hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, picot, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, picot, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch*, sc in last ch, picot, sc in same st. Working in the unused loops of foundation ch and over the tail, repeat from * to *, sc in last ch, slipstitch in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving a 6 inch tail for sewing.

HOLLY BERRY (make 3)

Ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Do Not join. Fasten off leaving about a 6 inch tail. Using your yarn needle, run the tail through the back loops of the sc sts, starting with the first sc. Pull tight to form berry. Tie a knot and use tail to sew the “berries” on item.

Quick Fix Winter Hat

If you're in a bind and need a winter hat quickly then this quick fix winter hat is the perfect pattern to get your hands on. Using a double strand of worsted weight yarn and a K hook you can work up this free crochet pattern in no time.



Quick Fix Winter Hat

Crochet Hook: K/10.5 or 6.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Using a double strand of worsted weight yarn and a K hook

Rnd 1) ch3, 11dc in 3rd ch from hook

Rnd 2) ch2, 2dc in each st around, skipping ch2, sl st into top of first dc (22dc)

Rnd 3) ch2, 2dc in first st(same st as joining), dc in next st, * 2dc in next st, dc in next st, repeat from * around. sl st to top of first dc, (33dc)

Rnd 4) ch2, 2dc in next st, dc in next 2sts, * 2dc in next st, dc in next 2sts, repeat from * around. sl st to top of first dc, (44dc)

Rnd 5-8) ch2, dc in each st around, (44dc)

Rnd 9+10) ch3, working in front of ch3, dc in last st of previous round, * skip next st, dc in next st, working in front of dc, dc in skipped st, (this creates a cross stitch effect) repeat from * around, sl st to top of ch3 (44dc)

Rnd 11) ch2, dc in each st around

Rnd 12) ch1, sc in each st around, fasten off weave in ends.

Free Crochet Scarves

Diamonds in Snow Scarf

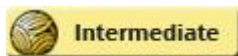

Winter is the perfect time to work up free crochet patterns. The Diamonds in Snow Scarf will keep you cozy and stylish throughout the cold season. This is a fun pattern that is worked in two parts.

Crochet Hook: F/5 or 3.75 mm hook,
J/10 or 6 mm hook, K/10.5 or 6.5 mm
hook

Yarn Weight: (3) Light/DK (21-24
stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- One skein each of Paton's Brilliant and Caron Simply Soft
- Hook Sizes F, J, K

Starting with **J Hook** and
Paton's Brilliant

1. ch 11, sc in 2nd chain from hook and each chain across, 10sc ch1, turn
2. sc in same stitch as c1, sc across, 10sc ch1, turn - repeat this for 10 rows - first diamond
3. ch 31, turn, sc in 2nd chain from hook and 9 more, 10 sc, ch1, turn sc in same stitch as ch1, sc across, ch1, turn, repeat this for 10 rows - 2nd diamond
4. repeat row 3 - 3rd diamond
5. ch 114, turn, sc in 2nd chain from hook and 9 more, 10sc, ch1, turn, sc in same stitch as ch1, sc across, ch1, turn ... repeat for 10 rows - 4th diamond



10.10. Repeat row 9, st st to beginning ch 3 and fasten off. (Three rows of the off white.)

6. Repeat row 3 two more times for 5th and 6th diamonds.
7. Change to **F Hook** sc around diamonds and in each chain going up one side and then down to where you started with the F Hook, fasten off.
8. With **K Hook** attach Caron Simply Soft Off White, ch 3, dc in each sc around, sl st to beginning ch 3.



9. 9. Ch3, dc around again, sl st to beginning.

Scarf with Hand Puppets

Your kids will love this new scarf you make them. Not only will it keep their neck warm, but it will also keep their hands warm too as it comes with cute little puppets. They can entertain themselves with puppet shows.



Crochet Hook: F/5 or 3.75 mm hook,
I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Yarn: RED HEART® “Super Saver®”: 1 Skein each 929 Bikini A, 722 Pretty n’ Pink B, 256 Carrot C. RED HEART® “Sport”: 1 Skein each 1 White and 12 Black for eyes
- Crochet Hooks: 5.5mm [US I-9] and 3.75mm [US F-5].
- stitch marker
- yarn needle

Size: 4¾” x 62” including puppets

Gauge: Scarf: 14 sts = 4”; 9 rows = 4” in hdc with larger hook. Puppets: 4 sts = 1”; 5 rows = 1” in sc with larger hook.

Instructions:

NOTE: Scarf has tapered ends designed to fit inside of the puppet neck.

SCARF

With larger hook and A, ch 9.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; turn – 8 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc to last sc; 2 sc in last sc; turn – 10 sc.

Rows 4 and 5: Repeat Rows 2 and 3 – 12 sc.

Row 6: Ch 2, 2 hdc in first sc, hdc in each sc to last sc; 2 hdc in last sc; turn – 14 hdc.

Row 7: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across; turn.

Repeat Row 7 until 46” from beginning.

Next Row: Ch 2, skip first hdc, hdc in next 11 hdc; [yo and draw up a loop in next hdc] twice, yo and draw through all 5 loops on hook – hdc2tog made; turn – 12 hdc.

Next Row: Ch 1, skip first hdc, sc in next 9 hdc; [draw up a loop in next hdc] twice, yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook – sc2tog made; turn – 10 sc.

Next Row: Ch 1, sc in each sc across.

Next Row: Ch 1, skip first sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc; sc2tog – 8 sc. Fasten off.

Edging Rnd: With right side facing and larger hook, join C in any st; ch 1, work sc evenly around entire scarf. Fasten off.

PUPPETS

**** Neck and Upper Head/Jaw:** With larger hook and B, ch 24; join with a slip st in first ch to form a ring, being careful that ch is not twisted.

Rnd 1: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), hdc in next 23 ch; join with a slip st in top of ch-2 – 24 sts.

Rnds 2-6: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc around; join.

Head Shaping-Rnd 7: Turn to work on the wrong side; ch 1, sc in first 12 hdc, ch 12, skip next 12 hdc; join with a slip st in first sc to form ring on which to crochet upper head/jaw. Now work in continuous rnds without joining, marking first st as beginning of rnd and moving marker up on each rnd.

Rnd 8: 2 Sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc, [2 sc in next ch, sc in next 5 ch] twice – 28 sc.

Rnd 9: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc] 4 times – 32 sc.

Rnd 10: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc] 4 times – 36 sc.

Rnds 11-14: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 15: * [Sc2tog] twice, sc in next 14 sc; repeat from * once more – 32 sc.

Rnd 16: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 17: * [Sc2tog] twice, sc in next 12 sts; repeat from * once more – 28 sc.

Rnd 18: * [Sc2tog] twice, sc in next 10 sc; repeat from * once more – 24 sc.

Rnd 19: [Sc2tog, sc in next 10 sc] twice – 22 sc.

Rnd 20: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 21: [Sc2tog, sc in next 9 sc] twice – 20 sc.

Rnds 22-24: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 25: [Sc2tog, sc in next 8 sc] twice – 18 sc.

Rnd 26: * [Sc2tog] twice, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from * once more – 14 sc.

Shape Nose-Rnd 27: * [Sc2tog] twice, sc in next 3 sc; repeat from * once more changing to C in last sc – 10 sc.

Rnd 28: With C, [sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc] twice – 8 sc.

Rnd 29: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc] twice – 10 sc.

Rnd 30: [Sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc] twice – 8 sc. Cut yarn leaving a long tail.

Weave yarn through remaining sts to close nose end. Bring needle through nose to point where nose rnds begin and wrap the yarn tightly around the base of the nose several times, fasten securely. Weave in end. This gives the nose definition and prevents the need for stuffing.

NOTE: When working the lower jaw, the “mouth corner” can be found by laying puppet with slit opening facing upwards. Attach yarn to the rightmost stitch and proceed working in continuous rnds as directed.

Lower Jaw-Rnd 31: With wrong side facing and larger hook, join B in first ch of mouth corner to work in 12 remaining ch-loops of Rnd 7 and 12 remaining hdc of Rnd 6, place marker; sc in each st around – 24 sc.

Rnds 32 and 33: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 34: [Sc2tog, sc in next 10 sc] twice – 22 sc.

Rnds 35-37: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 38: [Sc2tog, sc in next 9 sc] twice – 20 sc.

Rnd 39: [Sc2tog, sc in next 8 sc] twice – 18 sc.

Rnd 40: [Sc2tog, sc in next 7 sc] twice – 16 sc.

Rnds 41-42: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 43: [Sc2tog, sc in next 6 sc] twice – 14 sc.

Rnd 44: [Sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc] twice – 12 sc.

Rnd 45: [Sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc] twice – 10 sc.

Rnd 46: [Sc2tog] 5 times – 5 sc.

Fasten off. Weave yarn through remaining sts; draw up firmly; fasten securely.

Ears (Make 2)-Rnd 1: With larger hook and B, ch 2; working over beginning yarn end work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook; pull yarn end to close any gap at center.

Rnd 2: [2 Sc in next sc] 5 times – 10 sc.

Rnd 3: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc] twice – 12 sc.

Rnd 4: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc] twice – 14 sc.

Rnd 5: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 6: [Sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc] twice – 12 sc.

Rnd 7: [Sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc] twice – 10 sc. Fasten off leaving a 10” tail.

Sew ears in place. **

Repeat from ** to ** with C for second puppet, using B for nose.

Eyes (Make 4)-Rnd 1: With smaller hook and white yarn, ch 2; working over beginning yarn end work 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook; pull yarn end to close any gap at center.

Rnd 2: [2 sc in next sc] 4 times – 8 sc.

Rnd 3: [2 Sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc] twice – 10 sc.

Rnd 4: Sc in each sc around – 10 sc.

Rnd 5: [Sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc] twice; slip st in next sc – 8 sc. Fasten off leaving a 10” tail.

Embroider a French knot pupil with black yarn. Sew eyes in place.

Puppet Edging-Rnd 1: With right side facing and larger hook, join A in any st at cuff opening; ch 1, sc in each st around; join with a slip st in first sc – 24 sc.

Rnd 2: [Ch 3, slip st in next sc] 23 times, ch 3, slip st in first slip st. Fasten off.

Finishing: Lay the scarf flat; place a puppet at either end of the scarf with the opening towards the tapered scarf end and the nose facing away. Insert tapered end of scarf into the puppet opening about 2”; pin scarf to the upper part of the puppet only, (in the “wrist” area if this were a mitten). Sew the top layer of puppet securely with matching yarn to the tapered scarf ends, being careful not to sew the opening closed.

- US-I, 5.5mm hook
- Worsted weight yarn, approximately 185 yards each of two colors (Caron Simply Soft in Black and Grey Heather shown)
- Gauge: 13 dc = 4" wide (when working stripes); 12 sc = 3" (length of cuff)

Abbreviations Used:

ch – chain
BLO – back loop only
sc – single crochet
yo – yarn over
sl st – slip stitch
bpdc – back post double crochet
bpdc2tog – back post double crochet two together (decrease)
dc – double crochet
dc2tog – double crochet two together
bpsc – back post single crochet
sc2tog – single crochet two together

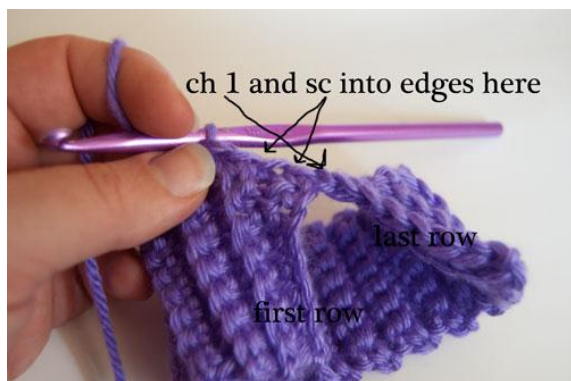
Wrist/Hand Cuff:

Using Color **A** and leaving a 8" tail, ch 13. Turn.

Row 1: Working in BLO, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, and each ch to end. Ch 1 and turn. {12 sc made}

Row 2 – 32(36): Sc in BLO evenly across Ch 1 and turn. {12 sc}

Row 33(37): Turn to work into the side of the cuff, looping the piece into a ribbed cuff, so that the first and last row meet. Ch 1 and sc into the side of 1st row and each row around, as shown below. Do NOT join yet. {32(36) sc}



Stripes Section:

Round 1: Insert the hook into the 1st st of Row 33(37), yo with Color **B**, and make sl st to join. Ch 2. [Bpdc in 2 sts, then bpdc2tog] 8(9) times. Join with sl st and ch 2. {24(27) sts}



Round 2: [Dc in 6(7) sts, then dc2tog] 3 times. Join with sl st and ch 2. {21(24) sts}

Round 3: [Dc in 8(10) sts, then dc2tog] twice. **Small size only: dc in last st.** Do NOT join. {19(22) sts}

Round 4: With Color **A**, join the end of the previous row with a sl st. Ch 2, and bpdc in each st around. Join with sl st and ch 2. {19(22) sts}

Round 5: Dc in 1st st. **(Large size only: 2 dc in the next st.)** Dc each st to last st. Dc 2 in last st. Join with sl st and ch 2. {20(24) sts}

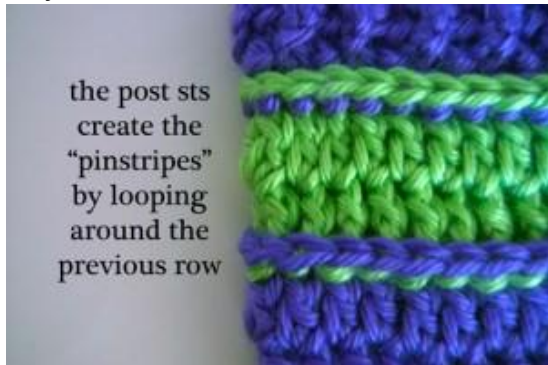


Round 6: Dc in each st around. Do NOT join. {20(24) sts}

Round 7: With Color **B**, join the end of the previous row with a sl st. Ch 2, and bpdC in each st around. Join with sl st and ch 2. {20(24) sts}

Round 8: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Join with sl st and ch 2. {22(26) sts}

Round 9: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Do NOT join. {24(28) sts}



Round 10: With Color **A**, join the end of the previous row with a sl st. Ch 2, and bpdC in each st around. Join with sl st and ch 2. {24(28) sts}

Round 11: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Join with sl st and ch 2. {26(30) sts}

Round 12: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Do NOT join. {28(32) sts}

Round 13: With Color **B**, join the end of the previous row with a sl st. Ch 2, and bpdC in



each st around. Join with sl st and ch 2. {28(32) sts}

Round 14: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Join with sl st and ch 2. {30(34) sts}

Round 15: Dc in the 1st st, then 2 dc in the next st. Dc in remaining sts to last st, 2 dc in last st. Join with sl st and ch 2. {32(36) sts} Break Color **B**, leaving a long enough tail to weave in later.

Upper/Arm Cuff:

Setup Row: With Color **A**, join the end of the previous row with a sl st. Ch 1, and bpsc in each st around. Join with sl st. {32(36) sts}

Row 1: Ch 13. Working in BLO, sc in the 2nd ch from hook and each ch. {12sc} Sc2tog in the next 2 setup row sts, as shown below. This is the "securing st" that attaches the vertical cuff rows to the horizontal setup row. Do NOT ch, turn.



Row 2: Skipping the securing st, sc in the BLO evenly. {12 sc} Ch 1 and turn.

Row 3: Sc in BLO evenly. {12 sc} Make securing stitch. Turn.



Row 4 – 31(35): Repeat Row 2 – 3.

Row 32(36): Sc in BLO evenly. {12 sc} Break yarn, leaving a 12" tail.

Sew the arm cuff together with whip stitch, joining first and last rows. Be sure to work into the BLO of the last row to maintain the ribbed look.

Back at the Wrist/Hand Cuff, whip stitch the first 3 – 4 sts together, leaving a thumb hole, as shown in the picture below. Weave in all ends.

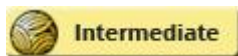

H hook

Rnd: round
Sc: single crochet
Ss: slip stitch
FO: Fasten off
hdc: half double crochet
dc: double crochet
fpdc: front post double crochet
bpdc: back post double crochet

NOTE: use a marker and work in rounds

ch 2 or form magic circle

Rnd 1: 8 sc in ring

Rnd 2: 2 sc in each sc around (16)

Rnd 3: *1 sc, 2 sc in next sc* rep from * to * around (24)

Rnd 4-19: sc in each sc around
ss 1, FO

(this is the hand part)

Thumb:

ch 2 or form magic circle

Rnd 1: 8 sc in ring

Rnd 2: *2 sc, 2 sc in next sc* rep from * to * around (10)

Rnd 3-9: sc in each sc around (7 rounds) ss 1, FO by this point you should have 2 pieces that look like this.



If you have bigger hands or longer hands adjust accordingly. add a couple rounds or subtract a couple rounds to make it smaller. The pieces should fit like that.

Take the thumb and sew it to the hand piece 4 stitches



then attach yarn anywhere on the bottom and sc around thumb and whole mitten. You should have 30 stitches total. (of course the count would change if you altered the

pattern)

Rnd 1-3: sc in each sc around (3 rounds)

Rnd 4: *4 sc, sc2tog* rep from * to * around

Rnd 5-9: sc in each sc around at this point if you wanted to make the entire mitten single crochet you could just keep going until you reached your desired length. I didn't I changed it up.

Rnd 10: ss1, ch 2, hdc in each sc around, ss1 to join

Rnd 11 to desired length: ch 2, *1 fpdc, 1 bpdc* rep from * to * around ss 1, FO.

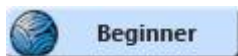

(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- Child's Version - RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 skein each 387 Soft Navy B and 984 Shaded Dusk C
- Women's Version - RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 skein each 624 Tea Leaf A and 387 Soft Navy B
- Men's Version - RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 skein 624 Tea Leaf A
- Crochet Hook: 5.5mm [US I-9]
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 16 sc = 4"; 17 rows = 4".

CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

Special Abbreviation: Sc2tog = [insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st] twice, yo, draw yarn through all 3 loops on hook.

NOTES:

These simple mittens are designed without a definite left or right hand and are worked in joined rounds. Cuffs are done in ribbed stitch rows by working sc in the back loops only. They are extra long for added warmth or can be folded at the wrist.

Men's mittens are worked in a solid color, Child's and Women's in stripe patterns as follows:

Work in 2 row stripes for Child's mittens, ending with 5 rounds of C at fingertips.

Work in 1 row stripes for Women's mittens, ending with 7 rounds of A at fingertips

Instructions:

Directions are for Child's size 4/5 yrs. Changes for sizes Women's and Men's are in parentheses.

Child size measures 6" around x 7½" long. Women's size measures 7½" around x 11½" long. Men's size measures 9½" around x 12" long.

MITTENS:

Cuff:

1. Using C (B, A), ch 15 (21, 24).
2. Row 1: Working in back loops only, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, ch 1, turn.
3. Repeat Row 1 for a total of 18 (22, 24) rows.
4. Fold cuff in half and join ends with slip st to form cuff. Do not fasten off.

Hand:

1. **Round 1:** Working along row ends on cuff, slip st evenly around for 18 (22, 26) sts, join round with slip st.
2. **Round 2:** Ch 1, place marker, [sc in next 8 (10, 12) sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st [20 (24, 28) sts].
3. **Round 3:** Ch 1, [sc in next 9 (11, 13) sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st [22 (26, 30) sts].
4. **Round 4:** Ch 1, [sc in next 10 (12, 14) sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st [24 (28, 32) sts].
5. **Child's size:** Proceed to next step.
6. **Women's size:** Ch 1, [sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st (30 sts).
7. **Men's size:** Ch 1, [sc in next 15 sts, 2 sc in next st] twice. Join with slip st (34 sts).
8. Repeat as established, working 1 more sc before increasing each round, for 2 more rounds (38 sts).
9. **Next Step:** Continuing with stripe/solid pattern as set, ch 1, sc in each sc around, join with slip st. Repeat for a total of 1 (3, 3) rounds.

Thumb Opening:

1. Next round: Ch 1, [sc in next 20 (26, 32) sts, ch 4 (5, 6), skip remaining sts and join with slip st to first st.

Upper Hand:

1. Sc in each st around for 8 (10, 12) rounds [24 (31, 38) sts], decreasing 1 st on last round for Women's size only [24 (30, 38) sts].
2. **Round 1:** [Sc 10 (13, 17), sc2tog] twice [22 (28, 36) sts].
3. **Round 2:** [Sc 9 (12, 16), sc2tog] twice [20 (26, 34) sts].
4. **Round 3:** [Sc 8 (11, 15), sc2tog] twice [18 (24, 32) sts].
5. **Round 4:** [Sc 7 (10, 14), sc2tog] twice [16 (22, 30) sts].
6. **Child's size only:** Sc2tog around (8 sts), fasten off. Continue with thumb.
7. **Round 5:** Sc in each st around.
8. **Round 6:** [Sc 9 (13), sc2tog] twice [20 (28) sts].
9. **Next 2 rounds:** Sc2tog around [5 (7) sts]. Fasten off at end of last round.

Thumb:

1. **Round 1:** Join yarn to thumb opening at st closest to upper

hand, ch 1, sc in each st around, joining with slip st [8 (9, 12) sts]. Sc in each st around for 4 (7, 8) rounds.

2. **Next round:** Sc2tog, sc to 3 sts from last st, sc last 2 sts tog [6 (7, 10) sts]. Sc2tog around, working last st as sc on Women's size [3 (4, 5) sts]. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

beg beginning
ch chain
dec decrease
ea each
mm millimeter
rem remaining
rep repeat
sc single crochet
sp space
st stitch
tr treble crochet
yd yard
YO yarn over

Materials:

110 yd 4/worsted-weight yarn
J-10 (6.0 mm) crochet hook
Yarn needle

Special Stitch: Tr cluster

YO twice and insert hook in first indicated st, (YO and pull through 2 loops on hook) twice, *YO and insert hook in next indicated st, (YO and pull through 2 loops on hook) twice; rep from * once. YO and pull through all loops on hook. Tr cluster complete. Counts as 1 tr.

Ch 5 (first 4 ch count as 1 tr now and throughout).

Row 1. 6 tr in 5th ch from hook. *7 tr.*

Row 2. Ch 4; turn. 2 tr in first tr, tr in ea rem tr across to last tr, 3 tr in last tr. *11 tr.*

Rows 3-6. Rep row 2. *27 tr.*

Row 7. Ch 3; turn (beg ch-3 *does not* count as tr). Skip first tr, dec 1 tr in next 2 tr, tr in ea rem tr across to last 8 tr, ch 3, skip next 3 tr, tr next 2 tr; thumb hole made. Tr cluster in last 3 tr. *20 tr.*

Row 8. Ch 3; turn. Skip first tr, dec 1 tr in next 2 tr, 3 tr in next ch-3 sp, tr in ea rem tr across to last 3 tr, tr cluster in last 3 tr. *19 tr.*

Row 9. Ch 3; turn. Skip first tr, dec 1 tr in next 2 tr, tr in ea rem tr across to last 3 tr, tr cluster in last 3 tr. *15 tr.*

Rows 10-12. Rep row 9. *3 tr.*

Finish off.

Finishing

Fold first wrist warmer in half and sew seam up side. Fold second wrist warmer in half the opposite way (this will put the seam toward the bottom on both wrist warmers) and sew seam up side.

Edging

Work 21 sc evenly around finger end of wrist warmer, and work 28 sc evenly around arm end of wrist warmer. Finish off; weave in all ends.

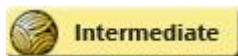

1. **With smaller hook, ch 9.
2. **1st row:** 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each ch to end of ch. 8 sc. Turn.
3. **2nd row:** Ch 1. Working in back loops only, 1 sc in first sc. 1 sc in each sc to end of row.
4. Rep last row until work, when slightly stretched, measures 7 ins [18 cm].
5. Change to larger hook. Ch 1. Turn and working along side edge of ribbing, proceed as follows:
6. **1st row:** (RS) Work 25 sc along side edge evenly spaced. Turn.
7. **2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc to end of row.
8. Rep last row until Mitten above cuff measures 1½ ins [4 cm], ending with RS facing for next row. **

Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc.
2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc. 2

next 8 sc. Turn.
10. **2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of
next 8 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in
each of next 3 sc. 2 sc in next

11. **3rd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of
next 14 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc

next 8 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in

over next 2 sc. 13 sc. Fasten

22. Sew top and side seam.

and larger hook, join yarn with
sl st at ch 1 marker for Thumb.
24. **1st rnd:** Ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as
last sl st. 1 sc in each sc around.
Join with sl st to first sc. 12 sc.

25. Rep last row until Thumb measures 2½ ins [6 cm].
26. **Next rnd:** Ch 1. (Sc2tog) 6 times. 6 sts. Fasten off leaving a long end. Thread yarn through darning needle and draw through rem sts. Fasten tightly.***

Left Mitten:

1. Work from ** to ** as given for Right Mitten.
2. **Shape Thumb gusset: 1st row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc. Turn.
3. **2nd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 3 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. Turn.
4. **3rd row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 5 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc. Turn.
5. **4th row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 7 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. Turn.
6. **5th row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. 2 sc in next sc. 1 sc in each of next 9 sc. 2 sc in next

- sc. 1 sc in each of next 14 sc. Turn.
7. **6th row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each of next 16 sc. Ch 1 (place marker for Thumb). Miss next 11 sc. 1 sc in each of next 8 sc. 25 sts. Turn.
8. **7th row:** Ch 1. 1 sc in each st to end of row. Turn.
9. Cont even until Mitten above cuff measures 6½ ins [16.5 cm], ending with RS facing for next row.
10. Work from *** to *** as given for Right Mitten.

Scarf:

1. With larger hook, ch 32.
2. **1st row:** (RS). 4 dc in 4th ch from hook. Miss next 3 ch. 1 sc in next ch. *Ch 3. 4 dc in same sp as last sc. Miss next 3 ch. 1 sc in next ch. Rep from * to end of ch. Turn.
3. **2nd row:** Ch 5. 4 dc in 4th ch from hook. *Miss next 4 dc. 1 sc in next ch. Ch 3. 4 dc in same sp as last sc. Rep from * to last 4 dc. Miss last 4 dc. 1 sc in next ch. Turn.
4. Rep last row until work from beg measures 62 ins [157.5 cm] omitting turning ch at end of last row. Fasten off.

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- **RED HEART® With Love™** 1 skein each:
 - 1703 Candy Pink **A**
 - 1807 Boysenberry **B**
- Crochet Hook: 6.5mm [US K-10½]
- Yarn needle

GAUGE: 16 sts & 14 rows = 4" **CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.**

ABBREVIATIONS: **ch** = chain; **dc** = double crochet; **hdc** = half double crochet; **sc** = single crochet; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **[]** = work directions given in brackets the number of times specified; *** or **** = repeat whatever follows the *** or **** as indicated.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

shell: (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same space.

sc2tog: [Insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st] twice, yo, draw yarn through 3 loops on hook.

dc2tog: [Yo, insert hook in next st, yo, draw yarn through st, yo, draw through 2 loops on hook] twice, yo, draw through 3 loops on hook.

PATTERN NOTES:

When working rows in back loop only, if your last st is a little loose, try working the last st into both loops of st.

Instructions:

Directions are for girl's size 2-4 (S). Changes for size 6-8 (L) are in parentheses.

Finished measurements: **Hat:** 16 (18)" in circumference.

Hat: 8.5 (10)" in diameter

Wristers: 2¾ (3¼)" wide; 3 (3½)" long.

HAT:

Band:

With **A**, leaving an 8" sewing length, ch 5 (7).

Row 1: Working in back bar of each ch, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in each ch across; turn—4 (6) slip sts.

Row 2: Working in back loops only, slip st in each st across, turn—4 (6) slip sts.

Repeat row 2 until 106 (114) rows have been worked or band measures 14 (15)" from beginning. Do not fasten off.

Rotate to begin working along sides of rows. Work now progresses in rounds

Crown:

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, work 64 (80) sc evenly spaced across side edge of band; join with a slip st in first sc.

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), skip first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3—64 (80) dc. Fasten off **A**.

Round 3: With right side facing, join **B** with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3, ch 1, sc in same st, *ch 2, skip 1 dc, sc in next dc; repeat from * around to last dc, ch 2, skip last dc; join with a slip st in first sc—32 (40) ch-2 spaces.

Round 4: Slip st in next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 space, *shell in next ch-2 space**, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * around, ending last repeat at **; join with a slip st in first sc—16 (20) shells. Fasten off **B**.

Round 5: With right side facing, join **A** with a slip st in ch-2 space of any shell, ch 1, sc in same space as joining, ch 5, (sc, ch 5) in each ch-2 space around; join with a slip st in first sc—16 (20) ch-5 spaces.

Round 6: Slip st in next ch-5 space, ch 1, 5 sc in each ch-5 space around; join with a slip st in first sc—80 (100) sc.

Round 7: Ch 3, skip first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3—80 (100) dc.

Size L Only: Round 8: Ch 3, skip first dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, dc2tog over next 2 sts, *dc in each of next 3 dc, dc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3—80 dc.

Both Sizes:

Round 8 (9): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 8 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—72 sts.

Round 9 (10): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—64 sts.

Round 10 (11): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 6 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—56 sts.

Round 11 (12): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 5 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—48 sts.

Round 12 (13): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 4 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—40 sts.

Round 13 (14): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a

slip st in first sc—32 sts.

Round 14 (15): Ch 1, sc in first st, sc in next st, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next 2 sts, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—24 sts.

Round 15 (16): Ch 1, sc in first sc, sc2tog over next 2 sts, *sc in next sc, sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—18 sts.

Round 16 (17): Ch 1, *sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—9 sts.

Round 17 (18): Ch 1, sc in first sc, *sc2tog over next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with a slip st in first sc—5 sts. Fasten off leaving a sewing length. With yarn needle, weave sewing length through tops of sts in last round, gather top and secure.

FINISHING: With yarn needle and sewing length, sew brim seam. Weave in ends.

WRISTERS (make 2):

Wrist Band:

With **A**, leaving an 8" sewing length, ch 7 (9).

Row 1 Working in back bar of each ch, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in each ch across; turn—6 (8) slip sts.

Row 2: Working in back loops only, slip st in each st across, turn—6 (8) slip sts. Repeat row 2 until 38 (42) rows have been worked or band measures 5 (5½)'' from beginning. Do not fasten off. Rotate to begin working along side edge of wrist band. Work now progresses in rounds.

Round 1 (right side): Ch 1, work 16 (20) sc evenly spaced across side edge of band; join with a slip st in back loop only of first sc.

Round 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), working in back loops only, skip first sc, dc in each sc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch-3—16 (20) dc.

Round 3: Ch 1, sc in first st, *ch 2, skip next dc, sc in next dc; repeat from * around to last dc, ch 2, skip last dc; join with a slip st in first sc—8 (10) ch-2 spaces.

Round 4: Slip st in next ch-2 space, ch 1, sc in first ch-2 space, *shell in next ch-2 space**, sc in next ch-2 space; repeat from * around ending last repeat at **; join with a slip st in first sc—4 (5) shells. Fasten off **A**.

Round 5: With right side facing, join B to remaining front loop of any sc in Round 1, ch 1, sc in same st as joining, *ch 2, skip next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * around to last sc, ch 2, skip last sc; join with a slip st in first sc—8 (10) ch-2 spaces.

Round 6: Repeat round 4. Fasten off **B**.

FINISHING: With yarn needle and sewing length, sew wrist band seam. Weave in ends.

Crochet Hook: F/5 or 3.75 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Snowman & Boy are 6¼" tall.

Materials:

- RED HEART® "Super Saver®": 1 Skein each 313 Aran A, 334 Buff B, 400 Grey Heather C, 505 Aruba Sea D, 319 Cherry Red E, 312 Black F, 256 Carrot G.
- Crochet Hook: 3.75mm [US F-5].
- Split-ring stitch marker, stuffing, yarn needle, black embroidery floss and embroidery needle, 3 ¼" black buttons, 4 ¼" red buttons, red crayon.

GAUGE: 16 sc = 4"; 16 rounds = 4".
CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size hook to obtain the gauge.

ABBREVIATIONS: A, B, C = Color A, Color B, Color C, etc; ch = chain; dc = double crochet; hdc = half double crochet; mm = millimeters; sc = single crochet; st(s) = stitch(es); yo = yarn over; [] = work directions in brackets the number of times specified; * or ** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Sc2tog = [draw up a loop in next st] twice, yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

To Change Color: Work last st of row until 2 loops are left on hook, drop old color, yo with new color and complete stitch. Fasten off old color.

NOTE: Do not join rounds; instead, place marker in first st of round and move up as work progresses.

SNOWMAN

Head & Body

With A, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook – 6 sts.

Round 2: 2 sc in each st around – 12 sts.

Round 3: * Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around – 18 sts.

Rounds 4-7: Sc in each st around.

Round 8: *Sc2tog; repeat from * around – 9 sts.

Round 9: 2 sc in each st around – 18 sts.

Round 10: * Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around – 24 sts.

Rounds 11-14: Sc in each st around.

Round 15: *Sc2tog; repeat from * around – 12 sts.

Round 16: 2 sc in each st around – 24 sts.

Round 17: * Sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around – 30 sts.

Rounds 18-22: Sc in each st around.

Round 23: *Sc2tog; repeat from * around – 15 sts. Add stuffing.

Round 24: Sc in next st, [sc2tog] 7 times – 8 sts. Fasten off leaving a long tail. Weave tail through remaining sts and draw tight.

Carrot Nose

With G, ch 3.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, dc in next ch. Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Hat

With F, ch 2.

Rounds 1-3: Work same as Head & Body Rounds 1-3 – 18 sts.

Round 4: Working in back loops only, sc in each st around.

Rounds 5-7: Sc in each st around.

Round 8: Working in front loops only, 2 hdc in each st around – 36 sts. Fasten off.

Finishing

Sew Carrot Nose in half and sew into place on Snowman's face. Embroider eyes according to picture. Sew buttons in place. Sew [Hat](#) on Head. Weave in ends.

BOY

Head & Body

With B, ch 2.

Rounds 1-8: Work same as Snowman

Head & Body

Rounds 1-8 – 9 sts.

Round 9: Sc in each st around.

Round 10: 2 sc in each st around – 18 sts.

Round 11: Sc in each st around.

Round 12: Repeat Round 11; change to C.

Round 13: With C, sc in each st around.

Rounds 14-16: Sc in each st around. Add stuffing.

Round 17: Working in back loops only, * sc in next st, sc2tog; repeat from * around – 12 sts.

Round 18: * Sc2tog; repeat from * around – 6 sts. Fasten off; draw remaining sts together.

Legs (Make 2)

With E, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook – 6 sts.

Round 2: 2 sc in each st around – 12 sts.

Round 3: Sc in next 5 sts, [2 sc in next st] 2 times; sc in next 5 sts – 14 sts.

Round 4: Working in back loops only, sc in each st around.

Round 5: Sc in next 5 sts, [sc2tog] 2 times; sc in next 5 sts – 12 sts.

Round 6: * Sc in next st, sc2tog; repeat from * around – 8 sts.

Round 7: Sc in each st around.

Round 8: Working in front loops only, * sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around; change to C – 12 sts.

Round 9: With C, working in unused back loops of Round 7, sc in each st around – 8 sts.

Round 10: Sc in each st around. Fasten off. Add stuffing. Turn up cuff of boot.

Coat

With D, ch 13.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in

each ch across; turn – 12 sts.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in 1st st, 2 sc in next st, * sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * across; turn – 18 sts.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc in 1st 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, * sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * across; turn – 21 sts.

Rows 4-8: Ch 1, sc in each st across; turn. Fasten off at end of Row 8.

Collar

With A, ch 15.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 14 sts. Fasten off.

Coat Panel

With D, ch 9.

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across – 8 sts. Fasten off.

Arms (Make 2)

With D, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook – 6 sts.

Round 2: * Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around – 9 sts.

Rounds 3-7: Sc in each st around.

Fasten off D at end of Round 7.

Round 8: Join E in back loop of any st, ch 1, sc in back loop only of each st around.

Rounds 9-10: Sc in each st around. At end of Round 10, add stuffing, fasten off and draw remaining sts together.

Cuff-Round 11: Join A in any unused loop of Round 7, ch 1, sc in front loop only of each st around; join with a slip st.

Fasten off.

Thumbs (Make 2)

With E, ch 2.

Row 1: Dc in 2nd ch from hook.

Fasten off. Fold in half and sew in place.

Hat

With C, ch 2.

Rounds 1-3: Work same as Snowman

Head & Body

Rounds 1-3; change to D at end of Round 3 – 18 sts

Round 4: With D, * sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st; repeat from * around – 24 sts.

Round 5: Sc in each st around; change to C.

Round 6: Sc in next 3 sts, * (sc, ch 1, hdc) all in next st, dc in next 2 sts, (hdc, ch 1, sc) all in next st, ** sc in next 10 sts; repeat from * to **; sc in next 3 sts. Fasten off.

Finishing

Sew Hat in place. Embroider face referring to [photo](#). Color cheeks with red crayon. Sew Legs in place. Wrap Coat around Body with opening in front; sew opening closed. Sew Coat Panel over opening; sew buttons in place. Sew Collar around neck. Sew Arms to Coat referring to photo. Tack Boy and Snowman together referring to photo.

nose (orange)

Thick crochet thread weight for his

Round five-Increase [2sc, then 2sc stitches into the stitch below] around (32)

Round six-Sc around (32)

Round seven -Sc around (32)

Round eight-Sc around (32)

Round nine -Sc around (32)

Round ten-Sc around (32)

Round eleven-Decrease... [2sc, then 2sc dec.] around (24)

Round twelve-Decrease... [sc dec. then 2sc] around (18)

Round thirteen -Decrease... [1sc, then 2sc dec.] around (12)

Stuff with toy stuffing

Round fourteen-Decrease ...[sc dec.] around (6)

Fasten off leaving a tail of yarn.

Body ball (base)

White 4ply cotton yarn

2 chain (or a magic loop if you prefer)

Round one-Into the second chain from the hook, do 6 single crochet stitches (6sc)

Round two-Increase... [2sc in each stitch below] around (12)

Round three-Increase ... [1sc, then 2sc stitches into next stitch below] around (18)

Round four-Increase ... [2sc, then 2sc stitches into next stitch below] around (24)

Round five-Increase ... [2sc into next stitch below, then 3sc stitches] around (30)

Round six-Increase ... [4sc, then 2sc into next stitch below] around (36)

Round seven-Sc around (36)

Round eight-Sc around (36)

Round nine -Sc around (36)

Round ten-Sc around (36)

Round eleven -Sc around (36)

Round twelve-Sc around (36)

Round thirteen-Decrease... [sc dec. then 4sc] around (30)

Round fourteen-Decrease... [3sc, then sc dec.] around (24)

Round fifteen-Decrease... [sc dec. then 2sc,] around (18)

Round sixteen-Decrease... [1sc, then sc dec.] around (12)

Stuff with toy stuffing

Round seventeen-Decrease ...[sc dec.] around (6)

Fasten off leaving a tail of yarn.

Hat

Black dk cotton yarn

The hat is crocheted in three separate parts.

Brim

(note this is crocheted as a solid circle)

Black dk cotton yarn

2 chain (or a magic loop if you prefer)

Round one-Into the second chain from the hook, do 8 single crochet stitches (8 sc) then slipstitch into first sc of the round below and do 1 chain stitch.

Round two-[2sc in each stitch below] around (16) then slipstitch into first

sc of the round below and do 1 chain stitch.

Round three-[2sc in each stitch below] around (32)

then slipstitch into first sc of the round below and do 1 chain stitch.

Round four-[1sc in each stitch below] around (32) slipstitch into first sc of the round below and fasten off, weave in short tail.

Top of Hat

(note this is a small crochet circle)

Black dk cotton yarn

Round one-Into the second chain from the hook, do 8 single crochet stitches (8sc) slipstitch into first sc of the round below and fasten off, leave a long tail.

Hat stack

(note this is crocheted as a rectangle, in rows)

Black dk cotton yarn

Make 15 chain stitches

Row one-Beginning in the second chain from the hook, sc to the end of the row, then 1 chain stitch and turn.

Row two-Sc to the end of the row, then 1 chain and turn.

Row three-Sc to the end of the row,

then 1 chain and turn.

Row four-Sc to the end of the row, then fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Scarf

(note this is crocheted as a long thin rectangle, in rows)

Blue, thick crochet thread cotton

Make 41 chain stitches

Row one-Beginning in the second chain from the hook, sc to the end of the row, then 1 chain stitch and turn.

Row two-Sc to the end of the row, then fasten off and weave in short tail.

Nose

Orange dk cotton yarn

2 chain stitches

Round one-Into second chain from hook, do 3sc (3)

Round two-2sc into each of the three stitches below (6)

Fasten off leaving a longish tail. Squeeze and pinch the nose into a carrot shaped point.

Sewing up the snowman toy

As this is a toy, make sure to sew the parts together firmly.

Refer to the photograph.

Use the yarn tails in the sewing up of the toy.

Sew the three white snowballs together.

Make the hat by first taking the large black rectangle (the stack part of the hat) and curl then sew it into a tube.

Then sew the small black circle (top part of the hat) to one end of the tube. Stuff this.

Finally, take the large black circle (brim part of the hat) and sew the tube centrally on the circle.

Wrap the scarf around the snowman's neck and using some of the same crochet thread that the scarf was made with, tack the scarf to the body firmly.

Sew the nose to the snowman's face.

Sew the completed hat firmly onto the snowman's head (at a slight angle to give him character).

Sew eyes and a lopsided smile onto his face with black yarn.

Sew in any loose ends.

Snowflake and Cookie Coaster

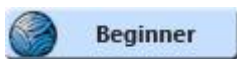

Often times the cold season will bring snow, but if you live somewhere warm then you might not get snow. Make these adorable Snowflake and Cookie Coasters so you can enjoy the snow too. This is an easy crochet pattern that is worked in a hexagon.

Crochet Hook: K/10.5 or 6.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran (16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- **Yarn** Istex *Plötulopi*, 100% wool unspun, 100g-3,53 ounces/300m-328 yards.
- **For the cookie:** 1 skein in brown and 1 skein in offwhite.
- **For the ice crystal:** 1 skein in dark blue and 1 skein in white.
- Hook 7mm US:K/10½
- Tapestry needle

Size Before felting 26cm/10 inches, after felting 24cm/9½ inches in diameter.

Skill Level

Beginner

Gauge 10cm x 10cm, 4inch x 4inch = 10 stitches x 6 rows in dc.

The pattern is worked as a hexagon.

Starting Chain: Ch 4, slip stitch in first ch.

Round 1 Ch 3, dc in circle; [ch 1, 2 dc in circle] 5 times; ch 1; join with slip st in this rows 3rd beginning ch. - - 12 dc and 6 ch-1 sp.

Round 2 Ch 4, dc in first ch, dc in previous rows 3rd ch, dc, dc in sp, ch 1, dc in same sp, [2 dc, dc in sp, chain 1, dc in same space] 4 times ; 2 dc, join with 1 slip st in this rows 3rd beginning ch. - - 23 dc and 6 ch-1 sp.

Round 3 Ch 4, dc in first ch, [4 dc, dc in sp, ch 1, dc in same sp] 5 times, 3 dc, dc in previous rows 3rd beginning ch, join with 1 slip st in this rows 3rd beginning ch. -- 35 dc and 6 ch-1 sp.

Round 4 Ch 4, dc in first ch, [6 dc, dc in sp, ch 1, dc in same sp] 5 times, 5 dc, dc in previous rows 3rd beginning ch, join with 1 slip st in this rows 3rd beginning ch. -- 47 dc and 6 ch-1 sp.

Round 5 Ch 4, dc in first chain, [8 dc, dc in sp, ch 1, dc in same sp] 5 times; 7 dc, dc in previous rows 3rd beginning ch, join with 1 slip st in this rows 3rd beginning ch. -- 59 dc and 6 ch-1 sp.

Round 6 Ch 1, 1 sc in previous rows dc [4 sc, 1 picot, 5 sc, 1 picot that finishes into the next ch sp, (4 ch, 1 slip stitch in chain space) 1 picot that finishes in dc from previous row] repeat 5 times between []; 5 sc, 1 picot, 5 sc, 1 picot that finishes in next ch sp, (4 ch, 1 slip stitch in chain space), 1 sc in ch sp, 1 picot that finishes in ch.

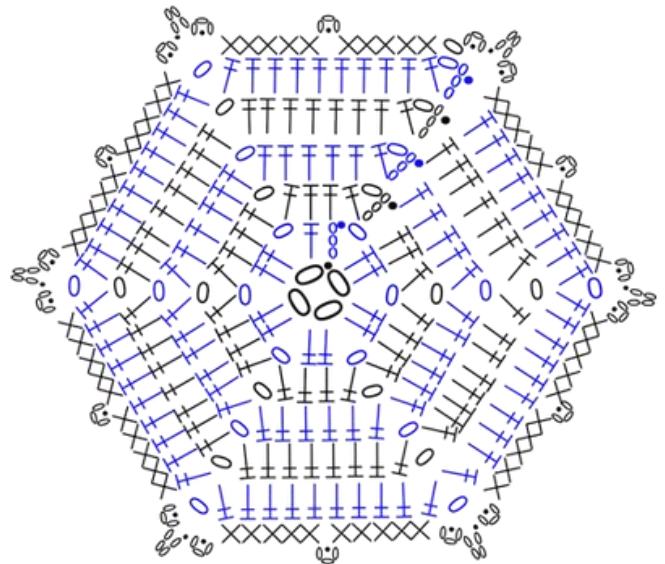
Cut yarn and weave in ends.

Abbreviations

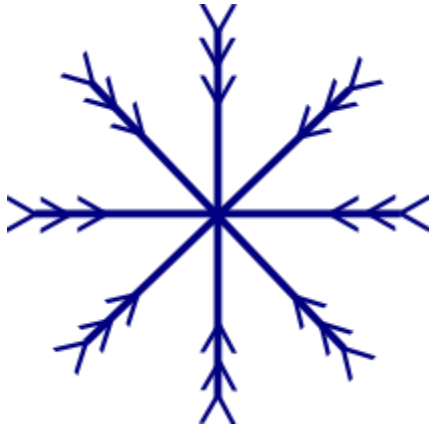
ch = chain
dc = double crochets
sp = space
sc = single crochet
slip st = slip stitch

Note: This pattern is written with US crochet terms. If you are more familiar with UK, Danish or German crochet terms, see my translation Crochet Chart.

If you prefer crochet charts, I made a chart for the coaster. If you are unfamiliar with reading charts, see my Tutorial how to read a Crochet Chart Motif.



With 2 strands of yarn sew the pattern beneath on top of the coaster.



Felt the coaster in the washing machine at 30 Celcius/85 Fahrenheit. I used the program for washing wool.

Sparkle Snowflake Applique

Using Red Heart Shimmer yarn and this fun Christmas crochet pattern you can make Sparkle Snowflake Appliques. Add the applique to a top, a bag or even use it as a gift topper. This is an easy step by step tutorial to follow.

Crochet Hook: I/9 or 5.5 mm hook

Yarn Weight: (4) Medium
Weight/Worsted Weight and Aran
(16-20 stitches to 4 inches)

Materials:

- 1 skein Red Heart Shimmer yarn in a color of your choice (or another worsted weight or "Category 4" yarn)
- Size "I" crochet hook (though "J" or "H" would work fine--sizing isn't really an issue!)

Abbreviations:

ch: chain

sl st: slip stitch

sc: single crochet

dc: double crochet

Special stitch: Trefoil (chain 3, slip stitch, chain 5, slip stitch, chain 3, slip stitch all into the same stitch)



To make: Chain 4

Winter Wonderland: 17 Winter Patterns to Crochet



Join with a slip stitch into the first chain...



Chain 2 (counts as first double crochet)



...to form a loop.



Double crochet into the loop (you now have 2 dc).



Double crochet into the loop ten more times (for a total of 12 dc).



Chain 2 (counts as the first dc).



Join with a slip stitch into the top of the beginning chain-2.



Double crochet into the same stitch (the joining stitch).



Chain 3.

Skip the next dc and dc in the base of the initial ch-2.



*Skip the next double crochet. Make 3 double crochet into the next double crochet stitch. Chain 3.**

Repeat from * to ** 4 more times.

Join with a slip stitch in the top of the initial ch-2. (You will have six sets of 3 dc and 6 ch-3 spaces)



...chain 5...



Trefoil (chain 3...



...slip stitch into the same stitch...



...slip stitch...



...chain 3 and slip stitch into the same stitch.)



Chain 2.

Trefoil (chain 3...



Double crochet into the same stitch
(base of the ch-2, where the trefoil is
also located).

...slip stitch into the top of the last
dc...



...like so...and finish trefoil with the ch5, sl st, ch 3, sl st).



(The finished trefoil looks like the photo above.)

Chain 2 and slip stitch into the base of the last double crochet. Trefoil at the base, working into the same hole as the first trefoil. (You will have a trefoil at the base, on the right, a set of ch-2 dc ch-2 with a trefoil in at the top in the center, and then a trefoil at the base on the left forming one "arm" of the snowflake.)



Work 2 single crochet into the ch-3 space.



Repeat four more times ending with the 2 sc in the last ch-3 space.



Skip the next dc and slip stitch into the next dc. (You have worked your sl st in the middle stitch of the 3 dc stitches).

Slip stitch into the base of the first trefoil to join.

Now, *trefoil, chain 2, double crochet, trefoil, chain 2, sl st in base of dc, trefoil, 2 single crochet into the next ch-3 space, skip the next dc and slip stitch into the next dc** to form the next arm of the snowflake.



There is your snowflake! Now weave in the ends and you are ready to applique this to a t-shirt or something else, or use as a gift topper.



Make more than one. After you make the first one you'll find that the rest are easy!



To sew onto a t-shirt use a straight needle and sewing thread. Cut a good length of thread--maybe 24" inches or so to start. Thread your needle and knot both ends so you have doubled your thread for stitching. Position your snowflake where you would like it and holding it in place, push your needle through from the wrong side until you reach the knot. Now stitch being sure to secure the center and all of the "arms" of the snowflake. I try and stitch directly through the yarn and hide my thread by using small stitches on the right side and longer on the back side. You can see how this looks in the photo above of the wrong side of the shirt. Nothing too fancy or precise here!
