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## Two Color Fur Striped Scarf

Size: About $7 \times 40$ in. $(18 \times 101.5 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ FUN FUR ${ }^{\circledR}$ (Art. \#320)
- \#124 Champagne 2 balls (A)
- \#136 Neon Orange (B)
- or colors of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: 9 double crochet stitches $=$ about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$.
EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL FOR THIS PROJECT.

## Scarf

With A, chain 18.
Row 1: Double crochet in 4th chain from hook and in each chain across. The beginning chain 3 counts as one $\mathbf{5} \mid$ Discover inspiration, how-tos, and thousands of free patterns at LionBrand.com.
double crochet, so at the end of Row 1 you will have 16 stitches.
Row 2: Chain 3 (counts as first double crochet), turn, double crochet in each stitch across and in the top of the chain 3-16 stitches at end of row.
With A, repeat Row 2 until the piece measures about $51 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. ( 14 cm ) from beginning.
Fasten off A.
Join B with a slip stitch and repeat Row 2 until B section is about $51 / 2$ in. (14 $\mathrm{cm})$.
Continue to repeat Row 2, alternating A and B every $51 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. ( 14 cm ), until Scarf measures about 40 in . $(101.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ from beginning.
Bind off.
Finishing
Weave in ends.
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## Zodiac Scarf with Bobbles

Size: About $83 / 4 \times 60$ in. $(22 \times 152.5 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ VANNÁS CHOICE ${ }^{\circledR}$ (Art. \#860)
- \#151 Charcoal Grey 1 ball (A)
- \#147 Purple 1 ball (B)
- \#145 Eggplant 1 ball (C)
- \#146 Dusty Purple 1 ball (D)
- or colors of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size $\mathrm{H}-8$ ( 5 mm )
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: $15 \mathrm{sts}=$ about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in pattern.
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

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When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to match the gauge, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## Stitch Explanation:

Sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.

## NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked in wedge shaped sections changing color following the Color Sequence. The wedges are shaped by scs, hdcs and dcs.
2. The Scarf is not difficult to make, but it is very important that you read the instructions for each row carefully and that you keep track of which row you are on!
3. The color is changed on every other row. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Fasten off old color.
4. Long beginning and ending yarn tails are left when changing color. These yarn tails will be used to join the Bobbles to the Scarf. Yarn tails should be about 10 in . $(25.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ long.

## Color Sequence:

Work *2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D; rep from * for Color Sequence.

## Scarf

With A and leaving a 10 in . $(25.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ beg yarn tail, ch 34 .
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 10 ch, hdc in next 11 ch, dc in last 11 ch - 33 sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this row and in all following rows), turn, dc in next 10 dc , hdc in next 11 hdc , sc in last 11 sc . Leaving long beg and ending yarn tails, change to $B$.
Row 3: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 sts, hdc in next 11 sts, dc in last 11 sts.
Row 4: With B, ch 3, turn, dc in next 10 sts, hdc in next 11 sts, sc in last 11 sts. Leaving 8 in . ( 20.5 cm ) long beg and ending yarn tails, change to C .
Rows 5-24: Rep Rows 3 and 4 ten times, continuing to change color following Color Sequence and leaving long beginning and ending yarn tails. At end of Row 24, fasten off, leaving a long ending yarn tail.
Row 25: Leaving a long beg yarn tail, join A with a sl st in top of first dc of last row. With A, rep Row 3.
Row 26: With A, rep Row 4.
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Rows 27-48: Rep Rows 3 and 4 eleven times continuing to change color following Color Sequence and leaving long beg and ending yarn tails.
Note: Rows 49-120 do NOT require long beg and ending yarn tails.
Rows 49-120: Rep Rows 25-48 three times continuing to change color following Color Sequence.
Rows 121-168: Rep Rows 25-48 twice, continuing to change color following Color Sequence and leaving long beginning and ending yarn tails. Fasten off.

## Finishing

## Bobbles (make 48-12 each with A, B, C, and D)

Ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 1, 5 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc - 10 sc at the end of this rnd
Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc2tog) 5 times; join with sl st in first st -5 sts.
Fasten off.

## Joining Bobbles to Scarf

Beg with one group of yarn tails on Scarf. You will be making a cord with every other yarn tail in this group, for a total of 12 cords.
For each cord, hold one yarn tail. Note that the strand of yarn is made of 4 thinner strands (plies) of yarn.
Carefully untwist the strand so that you can work with just one of the thinner strands.
Twist this one strand tightly in a clockwise direction, so that it begins to kink. Keeping the twisted strand taut, fold the strand in half, allowing it to twist around itself to make a cord.
Draw one end of the cord through one contrast color Bobble and knot to secure.
Repeat to make 12 cords, each with an attached contrast color Bobble, in each of the 4 groups of yarn tails. Weave in all rem yarn tails.

- \#150 Platinum 1 ball (F)
- \#151 Greystone 1 ball (G)
- \#145 Purple Topaz 1 ball (H)

- \#189 Garnet 1 ball (K)
- or colors of your choice

Gauge: $28 \mathrm{sc}+34$ rows = about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$.

## BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to match the gauge, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## Stitch Explanation:

Sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) (Insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.

## NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked in wedge shaped sections changing color following the Color Sequence. The wedges are shaped by scs, hdcs, dcs and trs.
2. The Scarf is not difficult to make, but it is very important that you read the instructions for each row carefully and that you keep track of which row you are on!
3. To change color, work the last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the st. Fasten off old color.
4. Long beginning and ending yarn tails are left when changing color. These yarn tails will be used to join the Bobbles to the Scarf. Yarn tails should be about 10 in . $(25.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ long.

## Color Sequence:

Work *2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D, 2 rows with E, 2 rows with F, 2 rows with $\mathrm{G}, 2$ rows with H, 2 rows with I, 2 rows with J, 2 rows with K; rep from * for Color Sequence.

## Scarf

With A and leaving a 10 in . 25.5 cm ) long beginning yarn tail, ch 64 .
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 14 ch, hdc in next 16 ch, dc in last 16 ch tr in next $16 \mathrm{ch}-63$ sts. Place a marker in the beg of this row to mark the Bobble side of the Scarf.
Row 2: Ch 4 (counts as first tr in this row and in all following rows), turn, $\operatorname{tr}$ in next 15 tr dc in next 16 dc , hdc in next 16 hdc , sc in next 15 sc . Leaving long beg

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and ending yarn tails, change to B .
Row 3: With B, ch 1, turn, sc in first 15 sts, hdc in next 16 sts, dc in next 16 sts, tr in last 16 sts.
Row 4: With B, ch 4, turn, tr in next 15 sts, dc in next 15 sts, hdc in next 16 sts, sc in last 15 sts. Leaving long beg and ending yarn tails, change to $C$.
Rows 5-22: Rep Rows 3 and 4 nine times, continuing to change color following Color Sequence and leaving long beg and ending yarn tails each time you change color.
At the end of Row 22, fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail.
Note: Rows 23-44 do NOT need long beg and ending yarn tails.
Row 23: Join A with a sl st in top of first tr of last row, ch 1, sc in first 15 sts, hdc in next 16 sts, dc in next 16 sts, tr in last 16 sts.
Row 24: Rep Row 2.
Rows 25-44: Rep Rows 3 and 4 ten times, continuing to change color following Color Sequence, and remembering that long yarn tails are not needed.
Fasten off.
Note: Rows 45-66 will need long (about 10 in. [ 25.5 cm ]) beg and ending yarn tails.
Row 45: Leaving a long beg yarn tail, join A with a sl st in top of first tr of last row. With A, rep Row 3.
Row 46: With A, rep Row 4.
Rows 47-66: Rep Rows 3 and 4 ten times, continuing to change color following Color Sequence and leaving long beg and ending yarn tails.
Rows 67-110: Rep Rows 23-66 once.
Rows 111-132: Rep Rows 45-66.
Rows 133-220: Rep Rows 23-66 twice. Fasten off.
At the end of Row 220, you should have worked a total of ten wedge shaped sections. The long yarn tails will all be on one side (the Bobble side) of the Scarf.

## Finishing

Bobbles (make 63-3 with A, and 6 with each of B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, and K)
Ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 1, 8 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.
Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc -16 sc at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc2tog) 8 times; join with sl st in first st - 8 sts. Fasten off. Cut yarn, leaving a 10 in . ( 25.5 cm ) long ending yarn tail.

## Joining Bobbles to Scarf

Note: Along the marked side edge of the Scarf you have 5 groups of long yarn tails. Begin joining Bobbles at the end of Scarf with A yarn tails.

## First Group of Bobbles

With the yarn tail of one Bobble A, ch for 2 in . ( 5 cm ). With one A yarn tail from Scarf, sl st down Bobble ch until you reach the Bobble. Fasten off.
With the yarn tail of one Bobble B, ch for 2 in . $(5 \mathrm{~cm})$. With one A yarn tail from Scarf, sl st down Bobble ch 12 | Discover inspiration, how-tos, and thousands of free patterns at LionBrand.com.
until you reach the Bobble. Fasten off.
Continue to join Bobbles in the same way to the remaining yarn tails in this group as follows:
Join one C Bobble with one B yarn tail from Scarf. Join one D Bobble with one C yarn tail from Scarf. Join one E Bobble with one D yarn tail from Scarf. Join one F Bobble with one E yarn tail from Scarf. Join one G Bobble with one F yarn tail from Scarf. Join one $H$ Bobble with one $G$ yarn tail from Scarf. Join one I Bobble with one H yarn tail from Scarf. Join one J Bobble with one I yarn tail from Scarf. Join one K Bobble with one J yarn tail from Scarf.

## Second Group of Bobbles

Attach Bobbles B-K to third wedge shaped (second group of long yarn tails on Bobble side of Scarf) same as in first group of Bobbles.

## Third Group of Bobbles

Attach Bobbles B-K and A-K to fifth and sixth wedge shaped

sections (third group of long yarn tails on Bobble side of Scarf) same as in first group of Bobbles.

## Fourth Group of Bobbles

Attach Bobbles B-K to eighth wedge shaped section (fourth group of long yarn tails on Bobble side of Scarf) same as in first group of Bobbles.

## Fifth Group of Bobbles

Attach Bobbles A-K to tenth wedge shaped section (fifth group of long yarn tails on Bobble side of Scarf) same as in first group of Bobbles.

Weave in ends.

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## Glitter Ruffle Scarf

Size: About 4 1/2 x 57 in. ( $11.5 \times 145 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ VANNA'S CHOICE ${ }^{\circledR}$ (Art. \#860)
- \#146 Dusty Purple 2 balls (A)
- or color of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\oplus}$ VANNA'S GLAMOUR ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ (Art. \#861)
- \#145 Purple Topaz 2 balls (B)
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\oplus}$ crochet hook size K-10 $1 / 2(6.5 \mathrm{~mm})$
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: EXACT GAUGE IS NOT ESSENTIAL TO THIS PROJECT.

## NOTES:

1. Scarf is worked with 1 strand each of $A$ and $B$ held tog.

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2. In this pattern, the turning chain does not count as a st. Since the turning chain does not count as a st, do not work into the top of the ch at the end of each row.
3. Don't be concerned if your stitch count is slightly different than the count noted in the pattern, your scarf will still ruffle beautifully.

## Scarf

With 1 strand each of $A$ and $B$, ch 122.
Row 1: Dc in 4th ch from hook, *dc in next ch, 2 dc in next ch; rep from * across 178 sts at the end of this row.
Row 2: Ch 3 (does not count as a st here and throughout), turn, dc in first st, * dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st; rep from * across - 237 sts at the end of this row.
Row 3: Ch 3, turn, dc in first st, *dc in next 3 sts, 2 dc in next st; rep from * across - 296 sts at the end of this row.

Row 4: Ch 3, turn, dc in first st, *dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in next st; rep from * across - 355 sts at the end of this row.

Row 5: Ch 3, turn, dc in first st, *dc in next 5 sts, 2 dc in next st; rep from * across - 414 sts at the end of this row.

Fasten off.

## Finishing

Weave in ends.

## Abbreviations:

ch = chain
dc = double crochet
rep = repeat
st(s) = stitch(es)
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## Crochet Rib Scarf

Size: About $51 / 2 \times 76$ in. $(14 \times 193 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ WOOL-EASE ${ }^{\circledR}$ THICK \& QUICK ${ }^{\circledR}$ (ART. \#640)
- \#504 Sandstone 2 balls
- or colors of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size P-15 ( 10 mm )
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: 6 stitches $=4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in sc worked in back loops only.

## BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches to match the gauge, try using a smaller size hook; if more stitches, try a larger size hook.

## Scarf

Ch 121.
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across - 120 sc at the end of this row.

Row 2: Ch 1, turn, working in back loops only, sc in each sc across.
Repeat Row 2 until piece measures $51 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. ( 14 cm ) from beginning. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Weave in ends.

## Abbreviations

ch $=$ chain
sc = single crochet

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# Halsey St. Pom Pom Helmet 

By: Lion Brand Design Team


Size: Finished circumference: $20 \mathrm{in} .(51 \mathrm{~cm})$. Hat will stretch to fit a range of sizes.
Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ HOMETOWN USA (Art. \#135)
- \#113 Cincinnati Red 1 ball (A)
- \#600 Bulldogs 1 ball (B)
- or color of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size P-15 (10 mm)
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\oplus}$ Pom-Pom maker
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: $91 / 2$ sts +6 rnds $=4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ over pattern.
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

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When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to match the gauge, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## NOTES:

1. Helmet is worked in joined rnds beg at lower edge. Do not turn at ends of rnds.
2. Color is changed by fastening off the old color and joining the new color.
3. Earflaps are worked back and forth in rows across lower edge of Helmet.
4. Sts for Helmet are worked through back loops only. Sts for earflaps are worked through both loops.

## Hemlet

With $A$, ch 48 ; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1 (RS): Join B with sc in same ch as joining, sc in each ch around; join with sl st in first sc -48 sc . Fasten off.
Note: Beginning on Rnd 2, work through back loops only.
Rnd 2: Draw up a loop of $A$ in any st, ch 4 (counts as first dc + ch 1 in this rnd and in all following rnds), sk next st, *dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch - 24 dc and $24 \mathrm{ch}-1 \mathrm{sps}$ at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp around; join with sl st in first sc -48 sc . Fasten off.
Rnd 4: With B, rep Rnd 2. Fasten off.
Rnd 5: From RS, join A with sc in any st, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp around; join with sl st in first sc.
Rnd 6: Ch 4, sk next st, *dc in next st, ch 1, sk next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch. Fasten off.
Rnd 7: Draw up a loop of B in any dc and ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), *sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; rep from * to last ch-1 sp, sk last ch-1 sp; join with sl st in top of beg ch -24 dc .
Rnd 8: Ch 3, dc in each st around, join with sl st in top of beg ch. Fasten off.
Rnd 9: From RS, join A with sc in any st, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.
Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.
Rnd 11: From RS, join B with sc in any st, sc in next 2 sts, sk next st, *sc in next 3 sts, sk next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc - 18 sc .
Rnd 12: Ch 1, *sk next st, sc in next st; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc -9 sc.
Rnd 13: Ch 1, *sk next st, sc in next st; rep from * to last st, sk last st; join with sl st in first sc - 4 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long yarn tail. Thread yarn tail through sts of last rnd and pull to gather. Knot securely.

## First Earflap

Note: Work through both loops when working earflaps.
Row 1 (RS): From RS and working through both loops across opposite side of foundation ch, join B with sc in any ch, sc in next 11 ch ; leave rem sts unworked 12 sc at the end of this row.
Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc in each st across - 11 sc .
Row 3: Ch 3, turn, sk next st, dc in each st across - 10 dc .
Rows 4 and 5: Rep Rows 2 and $3-8$ dc at the end of Row 5.
Row 6: Rep Row 3-7 dc.
Row 7: Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc in next st, sk next st, dc in next st, sk next st, sc in next $s t$, sk last $s t$, $s l$ st in edge of last row worked. Fasten off.

## Second Earflap

Row 1 (RS): From RS, sk 14 unworked sts following first earflap across front of Helmet. Working through both loops across opposite side of foundation ch, join B with sc in next foundation ch, sc in next 11 ch ; leave rem sts unworked - 12 sc .
Rows 2-7: Work same as Rows 2-7 of first earflap. Fasten off.

## Finishing

## Edging

From RS, join B with sl st anywhere along lower edge of Hat, sl st evenly around lower edge of Helmet and earflaps. Fasten off.

## Pom-poms

With $B$, and following package directions, make a large pom-pom. Tie pom-pom to top of Helmet. With A, make 2 medium size pom-poms. Cut 6 in . ( 15 cm ) lengths of $B$ and use lengths to tie one medium pom-pom to each earflap. Weave in ends.

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ VANNA’S SEQUINS ${ }^{\circledR}$ (Art. \#863)
- \#146 Merlot 1 ball (A)
- \#149 Moonstone 2 balls (B)
- \#150 Sterling 1 ball (C)
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ stitch markers

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## Stitch Explanation:

Tr2togBelow (Yarn over) twice, insert hook in same ch-1 sp as last tr worked 2 rows below, and draw up a loop, pull up to be even with working row, (yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice. Skip 3 sts. (Yarn over) twice, insert hook in next ch-1 sp 2 rows below and draw up a loop, pull up to be even with working row, (yarn over, draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

## Stripe Sequence:

Working in pattern, work 2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C.
Rep these 6 rows for Stripe Sequence.

## NOTES:

1. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops to complete st. Carry color not in use up side of piece.
2. Clutch is worked with a small hook to achieve a tight gauge, suitable for this project.

## Clutch

With A, ch 60.
Row 1 (RS): Sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in next 2 ch, *ch 1, sk next ch, sc in next 3 ch; rep from * to end - 59 sts.
Row 2: Ch 3 (beg ch counts as a dc on this row and on all the rows of this pattern), turn, dc in each st and ch-1 sp to end of row -59 dc .
Row 3: Change to B, ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, tr in first ch-1 sp of Row 1, pulling up loop to be even with working row, working behind tr st, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc, *Tr2togBelow in previous ch-1 sp and next ch-1 sp, working behind Tr2togBelow, sk next dc, sc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc, sc in next dc; rep from * to last 2 sts, tr in same ch-1 sp as previous Tr2togBelow, skip 1 dc, sc in top of turning ch.
Row 4: With B, ch 3, turn, dc in each st across.
Rows 5 and 6: Change to $C$ and rep Rows 3 and 4.
Rows 7 and 8: Change to $A$ and rep Rows 3 and 4.
Rep Rows 3-8 until piece measures about 14 in . 35.5 cm ) from beg, end with one row with B .
Do NOT fasten off.

## Finishing

Rnd 1: From RS with B, sl st evenly around outside edge of Clutch, join with sl st in first sl st.
Rnd 2: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each sl st around, join with sl st in first st. Fasten off.
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Rnd 3: From RS, join C with a sl st anywhere along Rnd 2. SI st in each space between hdc's of Rnd 2, join with sl st in first st. Fasten off.

## Clutch Body

On one long side of piece, place a marker 4 in . $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ down from short end.
From WS, join B where marked, ch 3, working towards opposite short end, dc in each slip st of Rnd 3 to corner of opposite short end.
Fold row just worked in half, bringing WS together. Working through both layers, sl st in each st to marker to join. Fasten off.
Rep to join opposite side edge.
Fold top edge of piece to make the Flap. With sewing needle and thread, sew half of magnetic closure centered on WS of flap. Sew other half of closure to RS of Clutch body, lining it up to match the position of the closure on the flap.
Weave in ends.

Rnd 2: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 12 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 12 sts, 2 sc in last st - 34 sts.
Rnd 3: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in last st -38 sts.
Rnd 4: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts, 2 sc in last st - 42 sts.

## Shape Sides

Rnd 5: Working through back loops only, sc in each st around.
Rnds 6 and 7: Working through both loops again, sc in each st around.
Rnd 8: Sc in next 14 sts, sc2tog, sc in next st, hdc in next st, hdc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, hdc2tog, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in next 14 sts -38 sts.

Rnd 17: With B, sc in each st around.
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Rnd 18: SI st in each st around.

Rnd 3: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts, 2 sc in last st -38 sts.
Rnd 4: 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts, 2 sc in last st - 42 sts.

## Shape Sides

Rnd 5: Working through back loops only, sc in each st around.
Rnd 6: Resume working through both loops and sc in each st around. Change to B.

Rnd 11: Sc in next 9 sts, sc2tog, sc in next st, hdc2tog, hdc in next 2 sts, hdc2tog, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in next 9 sts -26 sts. Change to $A$.

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Rnds 12-17: With A, sc in each st around.
Rnd 18: (Sc in next 6 sts, sk 1 st, 3 hdc in each of next 4 sts, sk 1 st, sc in next st)
twice -38 sts.
Rnd 19: Sc in each st
around.
Fasten off.

## Finishing

## Edging

Join B with sl st in center back, and working around entire top edge of Bootie, *insert hook from RS to WS through Bootie, yarn over hook and draw up a loop, draw through loop on hook; rep from * to work edging and 3 'loops', one at center front and one at center of left and right sides of Bootie or as desired. To end, remove hook from loop and take hook to WS. Insert hook from WS to RS, place loop on hook and draw loop through to WS. Cut yarn. Draw yarn tail through final loop and pull tight. Fasten off.

Rnd 8: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining (increase made), dc in next 6 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 6 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 128 sts.
Rnd 9: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 7 sts, ${ }^{*} 2$ dc in next st, dc in next 7 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -144 sts.
Rnd 10: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 8 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 8 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 160 sts.
Rnd 11: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 9 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 9 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 176 sts.
Rnd 12: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 10 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 10 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 192 sts.
Rnd 13: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 11 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 11 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 208 sts. Fasten off.
Rnd 14: From RS, draw up a loop of $C$ in same st as joining, ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 12 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 12 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 224 sts.
Rnd 15: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 13 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 13 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -240 sts.
Rnd 16: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 14 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 14 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 256 sts.
Rnd 17: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 15 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 15 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 272 sts.
Rnd 18: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 16 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 16 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 288 sts.
Rnd 19: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 17 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 17 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 304 sts.
Rnd 20: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 18 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 18 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -320 sts. Fasten off.
Rnd 21: From RS, draw up a loop of $D$ in same st as joining, ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 19 sts, *2 dc in next st, dc in next 19 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 336 sts.
Rnd 22: Ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 20 sts, ${ }^{*} 2$ dc in next st, dc in next 20 sts; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 352 sts.
Rnd 23: Ch 3, dc in each dc around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.

## Border

Rnd 24 (RS): With D, ch 3, working in back loops only, dc in same st as joining, 2 dc in next st, *sk next 2 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts; repeat from * around to last 2 sts, sk last 2 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch. Fasten off.

2. Motifs are worked in joined rounds, with RS always facing. Do not turn at the ends of rounds.
3. After working the First Motif, remaining Motifs are joined while working the last round (Rnd 8). No sewing is required.

## First Motif

Ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1 (RS): Ch 5 (counts as first dc and ch-2), *dc in ring, ch 2; rep from * 10 more times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg $\mathrm{ch}-12 \mathrm{dc}$ and $12 \mathrm{ch}-2 \mathrm{sps}$ at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 2: ( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each ch-2 sp around; join with sl st in first $\mathrm{sc}-12$ petals at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: BPSLST around beg ch of Rnd 1, ch 6 (counts as first BPDC and ch-3), *BPDC around next dc of Rnd 1, ch 3; rep from * around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch - 12 BPDC and $12 \mathrm{ch}-3$ sps at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 4: ( $\mathrm{Sc}, \mathrm{ch} 1,2 \mathrm{dc}, 3 \mathrm{tr}, 2 \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 1, \mathrm{sc}$ ) in each ch-3 sp around; join with sl st in first sc -12 petals at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 5: Sl st in each st to center tr of first petal, ch 7 (counts as first dc and ch-4 sp), (dc, ch 9, dc) in center tr of next petal, ch $4,(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 11, \mathrm{dc})$ in center tr of next petal (corner made), ch $4,{ }^{*}(\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 9, \mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 4)$ in center tr of each of next 2 petals, (dc, ch 11, dc) in center tr of next petal, ch 4; rep from * around, dc in same tr as beg, ch 9; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch $-4 \mathrm{ch}-11 \mathrm{sps}, 8 \mathrm{ch}-9 \mathrm{sps}$, and $12 \mathrm{ch}-4 \mathrm{sps}$ at the end of this rnd. Fasten off.

Corner Leaves: From RS, join yarn with sl st in any ch- 11 sp , ch $7,{ }^{*} \mathrm{Cl}$ in same ch-sp (leaf made), ch 4 , sl st in top of Cl just made (picot made), ch 6; rep from * 3 more times, sl st in same ch- 11 sp. Fasten off. Work Corner Leaves in remaining three ch-11 sps.
Rnd 6: From RS, join yarn in any ch-9 sp of Rnd 5 that follows a corner, ch 10 (counts as dc, ch 7), *(dc, ch 9, dc) in next ch-9 sp, sc in first picot of next group of corner leaves, ch 11, sc in next picot of corner, ch 13, sc in next picot of corner, ch 11, sc in last picot of corner, ( $\mathrm{dc}, \mathrm{ch} 9, \mathrm{dc}$ ) in next ch-9 sp, ch 7; rep from * 2 more times, (dc, ch 9, dc) in next ch-9 sp, sc in first picot of next corner leaves, ch 11, sc in next picot of corner, ch 13 , sc in next picot of corner, ch 11 , sc in last

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picot of corner, dc in same ch-9 sp as beg, ch 4, tr in 3rd ch of beg ch (last ch-4 and tr count as ch- 9 sp ) -8 ch- -11 sps, 8 ch- $9 \mathrm{sps}, 4$ ch- 7 sps , and 4 corner ch- 13 sps at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 7: *Ch 10, sc in next ch-9 sp, ch 8, sc in next ch-11 sp, ch 11, (dc, ch 6, dc) in next ch13 sp (corner made), ch 11, sc in next ch-11 sp, ch 8, sc in next ch-9 sp; rep from * around; join with sl st in first ch of beg ch -8 ch- 11 sps, 4 ch- $-10 \mathrm{sps}, 8 \mathrm{ch}-8 \mathrm{sps}$, and 4 corner ch-6 sps at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 8: *( 5 sc, picot, 5 sc ) in next ch-10 sp, ( 4 sc , picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 6 sc , picot, 6 sc) in next ch-11 sp, ( 2 sc , picot, 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6 sp, ( 6 sc, picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 4 sc, picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp; rep from * around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Second Motif

Ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Work Rnds 1-7 of First Motif. Fasten off.

## NOTES:

1. The Second Motif is joined to the picots of the First Motif across one edge.
2. Hold the First and Second motifs together with WS of Motifs together, sts matching, and RS of Second Motif facing you.

Rnd 8 (Joining Rnd): From RS, join yarn with sl st in any corner ch-6 sp, *(2 sc, picot, 3 sc , ch 2, sl st in corresponding picot of First Motif, ch 2, sl st in last sc made (joining-picot made), 2 sc ) in same corner ch- 6 sp , ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch- 11 sp , ( 4 sc , joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 5 sc , joining-picot, 5 sc ) in next ch-10 sp, ( 4 sc , joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 2 sc , joining-picot, 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6 sp, *(6 sc, picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 4 sc , picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 5 sc , picot, 5 sc ) in next ch- 10 sp , ( 4 sc, picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 6 sc , picot, 6 sc ) in next ch- $11 \mathrm{sp}{ }^{* *}$, ( 2 sc , picot, 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6 sp; rep from * around, ending last rep at **; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Motifs 3-6

Ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Work Rnds 1-7 of First Motif. Fasten off.

## NOTES:

1. You will be joining Motifs $3-5$ to form a strip of 5 Motifs. Motif 6 will be joined alongside one end of this strip. As you finish each Motif, determine which picots need to be joined to picots of neighboring Motifs. You may wish to place stitch markers in the picots of the neighboring Motifs to be joined.\}


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2. Hold this Motif and neighboring Motif(s) with WS of Motifs together, sts matching, and RS of this Motif facing you.

Rnd 8 (single-edge joining rnd): Work same as Rnd 8 of Second Motif, joining to neighboring Motif (instead of First Motif). Fasten off.

## Motifs 7-10

Ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Work Rnds 1-7 of First Motif. Fasten off.

## NOTES

1. You will be joining Motifs 6-10 to each other AND to Motifs 1-5. As you finish each Motif, determine which picots need to be joined to picots of neighboring Motifs. You may wish to place stitch markers in the picots of the neighboring Motifs to be joined.
2. Hold this Motif and one of the neighboring Motifs with WS of Motifs together, sts matching, and RS of this Motif facing you to work the joining rnd. When the first side of this Motif has been joined, hold this Motif and the second neighboring Motif together continue the joining rnd along this edge.

Rnd 8 (2-edge joining rnd): From RS, join yarn with sl st in any corner ch-6 sp, (2 sc, picot, 3 sc, joining-picot made, 2 sc) in same corner ch-6 sp, ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 4 sc , joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 5 sc , joiningpicot, 5 sc ) in next ch-10 sp, ( 4 sc , joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 2 sc , joining-picot, 3 sc , joining-picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6, ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, (4 sc, joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 5 sc , joining-picot, 5 sc ) in next ch-10 sp, (4 sc, joining-picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 6 sc , joining-picot, 6 sc ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 2 sc , joining-picot, 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6, * $6 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{picot}, 6 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-11 sp, ( 4 sc , picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( 5 sc , picot, 5 sc ) in next ch-10 sp, ( 4 sc, picot, 4 sc ) in next ch-8 sp, ( $6 \mathrm{sc}, \mathrm{picot}, 6 \mathrm{sc}$ ) in next ch-11 sp**, ( 2 sc, picot, 3 sc , picot, 2 sc ) in next corner ch-6 sp ; rep from * around, ending last rep at **; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Weave in ends.

Finished Length $101 / 2(11,12)$ in. $(26.5(28,30.5) \mathrm{cm})$
Note: Pattern is written for smallest size with changes for larger sizes in parentheses. When only one number is given, it applies to all sizes. To follow pattern more easily, circle all numbers pertaining to your size before beginning.

## Materials:

- LION BRAND® ${ }^{\circledR}$ HOMESPUN (Art. \#790)
- \#404 Lagoon $1(2,2)$ skeins
- or color of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size J-10 (6 mm)
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ stitch markers
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

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Gauge: $10 \mathrm{dc}+6$ rows $=4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

1. Cardi is worked in one piece beg at lower edge.
2. When Cardi has reached armhole length, chs are worked for sleeves. You'll need a separate strand of yarn to make the sleeve chs, so before beginning, cut a length about 3 yds . ( 3 m ) long, and set it aside until you reach the yoke portion of the Cardi.

## Cardi

Body
Ch 74 (78, 84).
Row 1 (RS): Dc in 4th ch from hook (beg ch counts as first dc), and in each ch across - $72(76,82)$ dc at the end of this row.
Rows 2-6 (6, 7): Ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, dc in each st across.

## Shape Yoke

Next Row: Drop loop from hook, but do not fasten off.
Next Row: From RS, sk first $15(16,18)$ sts, join a separate strand of yarn with sl st in next st, ch $22(24,26)$ for sleeve, sk next 6 sts along body for underarm, sl st in next st. Fasten off.
Next Row: From RS, sk next $26(28,30)$ sts following the end of the ch for the first sleeve, join a separate strand of yarn with sl st in next st, ch $22(24,26)$ for sleeve, sk next 6 sts for underarm, sl st in next st. Fasten off.
Pick up loop dropped at end of Row $6(6,7)$.
Row 1: Ch 3, turn, *dc in each st to first ch of sleeve ch, dc in each ch of sleeve ch; rep from * once, dc in each st to end of row $-104(112,122)$ dc at the end of this row.
Row 2: Ch 3, turn, dc in each st across.
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Row 3: Ch 3, turn, dc in next $7(11,10)$ sts, dc2tog, place a marker in dc2tog just made, *dc in next 9 sts, dc2tog, place a marker in dc2tog just made; rep from * $7(7,8)$ more times, dc in each st to end of row -95 $(103,112)$ sts.
Rows 4-8 (9, 9): Ch 3, turn, *dc in each st to 1 st before marker, dc2tog, move marker to dc2tog just made; rep from * $8(8,9)$ more times, dc in each st to end of row $-50(49,52)$ sts at the end of last row. Remove markers.
Row $9(\mathbf{1 0}, \mathbf{1 0})$ : Ch 3, turn, dc in next 7 sts, dc2tog, *dc in next $5(6,4)$ sts, dc2tog; rep from * $4(3,5)$ more times, dc in each st to end of row - $44(44,45)$ sts.
Fasten off.

## Finishing:

From RS, join yarn with sl st in lower front corner of Cardi.
Row 1 (RS): Work sl st evenly spaced up front, across back neck, and down opposite front. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

## Sizes:

Moon About 16 in. ( 40.5 cm ) diameter
Cloud About 22 in. $(56 \mathrm{~cm})$ across at widest point
Star About $11 \mathrm{in}$. ( 28 cm ) across
Materials:

- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ BABYSOFT (Art. \#920)
- \#100 White 2 balls (A)
- \#107 Bluebell 1 ball (B)
- or colors of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size H-8 ( 5 mm )
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ stitch markers
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle
- Fiberfill stuffing

Gauge: $14 \mathrm{dc}=$ about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## Stitch Explanations:

dc2tog (dc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.
hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.

## NOTES:

1. Each Pillow is made from 2 pieces, Front and Back. The Front and Back are crocheted together around the outer edges and stuffed before the seam is completely closed.
2. For all Pillows, fiberfill stuffing will show through the spaces between the sts. If desired, you can create fabric inserts for the crochet pieces. Instructions for the fabric inserts are at the end of this pattern.

## Moon Pillow

Note: Moon Pillow is worked in joined rnds, do not turn piece at end of rnds.

## Front

With A, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), work 14 dc in ring; join with sl st in top of beg ch -15 sts.
Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, 2 dc in each dc around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -30 sts at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -45 sts.
Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 2 dc , *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -60 sts.
Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 3 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -75 sts.
Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 4 dc , ${ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 4 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -90 sts.
Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in beg ch.
Rnd 8: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 5 dc , *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 5

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dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 105 sts.
Rnd 9: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 6 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 6 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 120 sts.
Rnd 10: Rep Rnd 7.
Rnd 11: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $7 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 7 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 135 sts.
Rnd 12: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $8 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 8 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -150 sts.
Rnd 13: Rep Rnd 7.
Rnd 14: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $9 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 9 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 165 sts.
Rnd 15: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $10 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 10 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -180 sts.
Rnd 16: Ch 3, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beg ch.
Fasten off.

## Back

Make the same as Front

## Finishing

With WS of Back and Front together, join A with sl st anywhere in outer edge. Working through both thicknesses, ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around outer edge, leaving a 5 in . 12.5 cm ) opening for stuffing. Stuff pillow with fiberfill, then continue to sc evenly spaced around outer edge; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Embroidery

With B, embroider TWINKLE, TWINKLE in chain st and 5 small stars in straight st.
Weave in ends.

## Star Pillow

## Front

Note: Center of Star is worked in the rnd. Points are worked individually, back and forth in rows.
With A, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), work 14 dc in ring; join with sl st in top of beg ch-15 sts.
Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, 2 dc in each dc around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -30 sts at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 5 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 5 dc; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 35 sts.
Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $6 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 2 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 6 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 40 sts.

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Rnd 5: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next 7 dc , 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 7 dc ; rep from * around; join with sl st in top of beg ch -45 sts.
Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in next $8 \mathrm{dc},{ }^{*} 4 \mathrm{dc}$ in next dc, dc in next 8 dc ; rep from * around, work 2 more dc in same st as joining; join with sl st in top of beg ch -60 sts.

## First Point

Row 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this row and in all following rows), dc in next 11 dc , dc in next sp between sts; leave remaining sts unworked -13 sts at the end of this row.
Row 2: Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, dc in each st to last 2 sts, dc2tog - 11 sts.
Row 3: Ch 3, turn, dc in each st across.
Rows 4 and 5: Rep Row 2 twice -7 sts at the end of Row 5.
Row 6: Rep Row 3.
Rows 7 and 8: Rep Row 2 twice -3 sts at the end of Row 8.
Row 9: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
Fasten off.

## Next 4 Points

From RS, join A with sl st in next unworked dc following previous point, rep Rows 1-9 of first point. Rep for a total of 5 points.

## Back

Make the same as Front.

## Finishing

With WS of Back and Front together, join A with sl st anywhere in outer edge. Working through both thicknesses, ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around outer edge, leaving a 5 in . $(12.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ opening for stuffing. Stuff pillow with fiberfill, then continue to sc evenly spaced around outer edge; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Embroidery

With B embroider LITTLE on one pillow and STAR on the other pillow in chain st.

## Cloud Pillow

## Front

Note: Cloud Pillow beg working in joined rnds and then changes to rows.
With B, ch 51.
Rnd 1 (RS): Work 3 sc in 2 nd ch from hook, sc in next $48 \mathrm{ch}, 6 \mathrm{sc}$ in last ch. Working along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next $48 \mathrm{ch}, 3 \mathrm{sc}$ in last ch; join with sl st in first sc - 108 sc .
Rnd 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this rnd and in all following rnds), 4 dc in next st, dc in next 50 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 50 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next st; join with sl st in top of beg ch 120 dc at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 53 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 5 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 53 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch - 124 sts.

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Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in next 3 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 54 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 6 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 54 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch -136 sts.
Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 57 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 9 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 57 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts; join with sl st in first sc -140 sts.
Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in next 6 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 58 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 10 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 58 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 3 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch -152 sts.
Rnd 7: Ch 3, dc in next 8 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 61 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 13 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 61 sts, 4 dc in next st, dc in next 4 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch -164 sts.

Rnd 8: Ch 3, dc in next 10 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 64 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 16 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 64 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 5 sts; join with sl st in top of beg ch -168 sts.
Rnd 9: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 11 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 65 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 17 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 65 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts; join with sl st in first sc -172 sts.
Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, sc in next 12 sts, 2 sc in next st, place marker in 2nd sc of 2 -sc group just made for beg of top of Cloud, hdc in next st, dc in next 64 sts, hdc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 18 sts, 2 sc in next st, place marker in first sc of 2-sc group just made for beg of bottom of Cloud, hdc in next st, dc in next 64 sts, hdc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in last 5 sts; join with sl st in first sc -176 sts. Fasten off.

## Top of Cloud

Work now proceeds back and forth in rows.
Row 1 (RS): From RS, join B with sl st in first marked st, ready to work across long side of piece, remove marker, ch 1, hdc in next st, dc in next 63 sts, hdc in next st, sc in next st; leave rem sts unworked -66 sts at the end of this row.
Row 2: Ch 2 (counts as first hdc in this row and in all following rows), turn, hdc2tog, dc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog - 64 sts.
Rows 3 and 4: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc 2 tog -60 sts at the end of Row 4.
Rows 5 and 6: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 7: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc 2 tog -59 sts.
Row 8: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to end of row - 58 sts.
Row 9: Rep Row 5.
Row 10: Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 5 sts, hdc in next 42 sts, hdc2tog; leave last st unworked - 55 sts.
Row 11: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in next 39 sts, dc in next 5 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 50 sts.
Row 12: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next 12 sts, hdc in next 30 sts, $s c$ in next 2 sts, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 45 sts.
Row 13: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next 2 sts, hdc in next 25 sts, $s c$ in next 2 sts, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 30 sts.
Row 14: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next st, hdc in next 24 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 27 sts.

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Row 15: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next st, hdc in next 21 sts, $s c$ in next st, $s l$ st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 24 sts.
Row 16: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next st, hdc in next 5 sts, dc in next 7 sts, hdc in next 5 sts, sc in next 2 sts, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked -21 sts.
Row 17: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, dc in next 7 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, sc in next st, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked - 18 sts.
Row 18: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc in next 12 sts, sl st in next st; leave rem sts unworked -13 sts. Do not fasten off.

## Bottom of Cloud

Row 1 (RS): Ch 1, turn, sc evenly spaced around outside edge of piece to next marked st at beg of bottom of Pillow, 2 sc in marked st, remove marker, working across bottom of Pillow, *sc in next 10 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 10 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 10 sts; rep from * once; leave rem sts unworked -70 sts.
Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc in next 9 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 9 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 21 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, dc in next 9 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 11 sts, sl st in next st; leave last st unworked 68 sts.
Row 3: Ch 1, turn, sk the sl st, sc evenly spaced around rem Pillow to beg of Row 1; join with sl st in first sc of Row 1. Fasten off.

## Back

Make the same as Front.

## Finishing

Rnd 1: With WS of Back and Front together, join B with sl st anywhere in outer edge. Working through both thicknesses, ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around outer edge, leaving a 5 in . ( 12.5 cm ) opening for stuffing. Stuff pillow with fiberfill, then continue to sc evenly spaced around outer edge; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. Rnd 2: Join A with sl st anywhere in outer edge, ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## Embroidery

With A, embroider 3 stars in straight st.
Weave in ends.

## Optional Fabric Insert for Pillows

Materials:

- Cotton or cotton blend fabric, $3 / 4 \mathrm{yd}(3 / 4 \mathrm{~m})$ each for Cloud and Moon Pillows; $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}(1 / 2 \mathrm{~m})$ for 2 Star Pillows
- Straight pins
- Sewing needle and thread or sewing machine

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For each pillow, fold fabric in half, with RS together, and lay fabric onto a flat surface. Lay crochet piece onto doubled fabric and pin in place. Cut shape from fabric, about $1 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. $(1.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ outside edge of crochet shape. Unpin and remove crochet shape. Keeping the 2 fabric pieces with RS together, seam pieces by hand or machine, $1 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. ( 1.5 cm ) from outside edge and leaving an opening for stuffing.
Turn fabric to RS and stuff. By hand, sew opening closed.

Insert fabric insert into crocheted pillow.

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## New Slant Afghan

Size: About $39 \times 62$ in. $(99 \times 157.5 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Materials:

- LION BRAND® WOOL-EASE (Art. \#620)
- \#177 Loden 2 balls (A)
- \#159 Mustard 2 balls (B)
- \#173 Sage 2 balls (C)
- \#199 Pumpkin 2 balls (D)
- \#127 Mink Brown 2 balls (E)
- \#188 Paprika 2 balls (F)
- \#167 Eggplant 2 balls (G)
- \#191 Violet 2 balls (H)
- or colors of your choice
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook size J-10 ( 6 mm )
- LION BRAND ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

Gauge: 12 sts = about $4 \mathrm{in} .(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ in pattern.

## BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to match the gauge, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## NOTES:

1. Afghan is worked in 4 Strips. The Strips are made of wedge shaped sections. The wedges are shaped with scs, hdcs and dcs, and change color following the Color Sequence. The Strips are sewed together to make the Afghan.
2. The color is changed on every other row. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the st. Fasten off old color.
3. Cords and bobbles are worked separately, then attached to complete the Afghan.

## Color Sequence for Strips 1 and 3

Work *2 rows with A, 2 rows with B, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with D, 2 rows with E, 2 rows with F, 2 rows with G, and 2 rows with H; rep from * for Color Sequence.

## Color Sequence for Strips 2 and 4

Work *2 rows with H, 2 rows with G, 2 rows with F, 2 rows with E, 2 rows with D, 2 rows with C, 2 rows with B, and 2 rows with A; rep from * for Color Sequence.

## STRIPS 1 and 3

With A, ch 43.
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 13 ch , hdc in next 14 ch , dc in last 14 ch - 42 sts.

Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this row and in all following rows), turn, dc in next 13 dc , hdc in next 14 hdc , sc in last 14 sc . Change to B .
Row 3: With B, ch 1 (counts as first sc in this row and in all following rows), turn, sc in first 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, dc in last 14 sts.
Row 4: With B, ch 3, turn, dc in next 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, sc in last 14 sts. Change to $C$.

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## Wool-Ease ${ }^{\circledR}$

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Rows 5-26: Rep Rows 3 and 4 eleven times continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 1 and 3 . At the end of Row 26, fasten off.
Row 27: Join $F$ with a sl st at top of first dc on last row, ch 1, sc in next 14 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, dc in last 14 sts.
Row 28: With F, ch 3, turn, dc in first 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, sc in last 14 sts Change to G.
Rows 29-52: Rep Rows 3 and 4 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 1 and 3. At end of Row 52, fasten off.
Rows 53 and 54: With C, rep Rows 27 and 28.
Rows 55-78: Rep Rows 3 and 4 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 1 and 3.
Rows 79-182: Rep Rows 27-78 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 1 and 3. Notes: There should be a total of 7 wedge shaped sections. The last 2 rows you work will be worked with C. Fasten off.

## STRIPS 2 and 4

With H, ch 43.
Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 13 ch, hdc in next 14 ch, dc in last 14 ch - 42 sts.
Row 2: Ch 3 (counts as first dc in this row and in all following rows), turn, dc in next 13 dc , hdc in next 14 hdc , sc in last 14 sc . Change to G .

Row 3: With G, ch 1, turn, sc in first 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, dc in last 14 sts.
Row 4: With G, ch 3, turn, dc in next 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, sc in last 14 sts. Change to F.
Rows 5-26: Rep Rows 3 and 4 eleven times continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 2 and 4. At the end of Row 26, fasten off.
Row 27: Join $C$ with a sl st at top of first dc on last row, ch 1, sc in next 14 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, dc in last 14 sts.
Row 28: With C, ch 3, turn, dc in first 13 sts, hdc in next 14 sts, sc in last 14 sts Change to B.
Rows 29-52: Rep Rows 3 and 4 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 2 and 4. At end of Row 52, fasten off.
Rows 53 and 54: With F, rep Rows 27 and 28.
Rows 55-78: Rep Rows 3 and 4 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 2 and 4.
Rows 79-182: Rep Rows 27-78 continuing to change color following Color Sequence for Strips 2 and 4. Notes: There should be a total of 7 wedge shaped sections. The last 2 rows you work will be worked with F. Fasten off.

## Finishing

Lay Strips in numerical order side by side onto a flat surface, matching curves.
Note: Upper and lower edges will be uneven. Sew Strips together along adjoining edges.

## Bobbles (make 126, in colors as desired)

Ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.
Rnd 1: Ch 1, 5 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc.
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Rnd 2: Ch 1, 3 sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc -15 sc at the end of this rnd.
Rnd 3: Ch 1, (sc3tog) 5 times; join with sl st in first sc -5 sts. Fasten off.

## Attaching Bobbles

Attach 16 Bobbles to each inner curve across long sides of Afghan - 3 groups of 16 Bobbles each along each side of Afghan. Across each short end of Afghan, attach 5 Bobbles at each end of each seam between Strips 3 groups of 5 Bobbles each across each short end of Afghan.

## NOTES:

1. Each Bobble is attached to the Afghan with a cord.
2. Cords can be twisted cords, as explained in the instructions below, or a crocheted chain.
3. We used a yarn color that contrasted with the Bobble color to make each cord.

## To attach Bobbles with Twisted Cord

Cut a 15 in . $(38 \mathrm{~cm})$ length of yarn in desired color. Gently separate the length of yarn into 4 strands.
With one hand at each end of one strand, twist the strand until tightly twisted, then fold strand in half and let it twist back on itself. Knot ends about 3 in. ( 7.5 cm ) from fold.
From RS, insert hook through Afghan, then through fold of twisted cord. Draw fold of cord through edge of Afghan, forming a loop. Pull ends of cord through this loop, then pull to tighten. Sew Bobble to ends of cord.

## To attach Bobbles with Crocheted Chain

If you'd prefer to make a simple crocheted chain to attach each Bobble, simply join yarn to Afghan with a sl st. Make a ch about $21 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. $(6.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ long, then fasten off. Sew Bobble to end of ch.

Weave in ends.

If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make a 4 in . $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$ square, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

## NOTES:

1. Afghan is made from 20 Blocks that are sewn together following the Assembly Diagram.
2. Each Block is made from 3 Strips ( 2 Side Strips and 1 Center Strip); each Strip is worked in 3 colors.
3. Border is crocheted around the outside edge of the completed Afghan.
4. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops to complete st. Fasten off old color.
5. A diagram is included to provide an overview of the Afghan.

## Block 1 (make 2)

## Side Strip (make 2)

With A, ch 10 . Hdc in 2 nd ch from hook and in each ch across -8 hdc.
Row 1: Ch 2 (does not count as first hdc), turn, hdc in each st across.
Rep Row 1 until piece measures 3 in . $(7.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ from beg. Change to $C$. With C, rep Row 1 for 3 in . 7.5 cm ). Change to $A$.
With A, rep Row 1 for 3 in . $(7.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ). Fasten off.

## Center Strip

Make same as Side Strip, using colors C, E, C.

## Assembly

Following diagrams, sew long edge of Side Strips to Center Strip.

## Blocks 2-9

Work same as Block 1 using the following colors:
Block 2 (make 2): Side Strips: F, C, F; Center Strip: C, E, C.
Block 3 (make 2): Side Strips: G, C, G; Center Strip: C, E, C.
Block 4 (make 5): Side Strips: B, H, B; Center Strip: H, E, H.
Block 5 (make 2): Side Strips: G, F, G; Center Strip: F, E, F.
Block 6 (make 1): Side Strips: C, G, C; Center Strip: G, E, G.
Block 7 (make 2): Side Strips: G, D, G; Center Strip: D, E, D.
Block 8 (make 3): Side Strips: D, H, D; Center Strip: H, E, H.
Block 9 (make 1): Side Strips: C, A, C; Center Strip: A, E, A.

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Finishing
Following Assembly Diagram, sew Blocks together.

## Border

Join C with a sl st anywhere along outside edge of Afghan.
Rnd 1: Ch 2, work hdc evenly spaced around outside edge of Afghan, working 3 hdc at each corner; join with sl st in first hdc.

Rep Rnd 1 until Border measures about 2 in. ( 5 cm ). Change to A .
Rep Rnd 1 with A for 2 in. ( 5 cm ). Change to C.
Rep Rnd 1 with C for 2 in. ( 5 cm ).
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Fasten off.
Weave in ends.
